**Star Valley Ranch Topped the State with the Fastest Population Growth in 2025**

**CHEYENNE** – According to the U.S. Census Bureau, nearly half of the 30 largest cities and towns (over 2,000 people) in Wyoming added residents between July 1, 2024 and July 1, 2025, where the city of Cheyenne added the most residents. These new estimates provide a look at how the population has changed in each of Wyoming’s incorporated communities since the 2020 Census.

For cities and towns with population over 2,000, Star Valley Ranch demonstrated the fastest annual growth (1.6%), followed by Mills (1.4%) and Evansville (1.2%), while Cheyenne (734) and Sheridan (221) showed the largest numerical addition from 2024 to 2025. It’s the first time that the city of Sheridan surpassed the population milestone of 20,000. Three cities or towns, Afton (-23), Kemmerer (-24), and Rawlins (-68) experienced annual population declines of around 1.0 percent. Rock Springs and Rawlins are the only places that lost more than 60 residents during the year.

As of July 1, 2025, there were 403,626 people or 68.6 percent in Wyoming living in incorporated places. Nearly half (49.2%) of the state’s residents lived in eleven cities and towns with population of more than 10,000. Wyoming’s total population increased by 11,881 or 2.1 percent since April 1, 2020 Census. This growth rate was significantly higher than the 1.0% growth observed in both the 11 largest cities and the 30 largest cities and towns combined. “Since the COVID-19 pandemic, less populated and more affordable areas have gained attractiveness,” noted Dr. Wenlin Liu, Administrator of the Economic Analysis Division in the Wyoming Department of Administration and Information. “Some professional and business workers with telework capabilities opted to move to rural areas.”
