

RE: Gurley Ave. Signing Request for Radar Speed Displays

Summary:

This memo is being provided as a result of a citizen request for placement of a fixed location radar speed display sign on South Gurley Avenue due to concerns of excessive speed, inattentive traffic, and other safety concerns, specifically in the area from 4th Street to 9th Street.

South Gurley Avenue is classified as a minor arterial to the north of 4th St., and as a collector south of 4th St. The current speed limit posting on this route is 30mph from Warlow Dr., south to 12th St., which is a reasonable and customary speed limit for a roadway with these classifications and characteristics. City traffic safety staff collected 48 hours of speed data on August 3rd – 5th, 2015 on South Gurley Avenue, between 5th and 6th Streets and found the 85th percentile speeds for both directions were less than 34mph. The 95th percentile speeds were 34mph for northbound and 37mph for southbound traffic. Based upon the data collected (12,523 data points), it appears excessive speeding is not routine in this area.

To help resolve the concerns with this location, we would like to work with P.D. on targeted or directed patrols of this specific stretch of Gurley Ave., temporary placement of the City's Portable Radar Signs, or consideration of installing a solar powered warning beacon atop the existing southbound static speed limit sign. The data suggests that southbound through traffic carries some speed off of the Gurley Overpass.

Background and Speed Data Analysis:

In review of any reported concerns for speeding, traffic signing, speed limits, and school zones of the like, the Engineering Division works closely with Traffic Safety to assess the concerns and help find resolve to the reported conditions. In the matter of speed enforcement, the City Police Department also is relied heavily upon for assistance in compliance measures.

In response to this specific request, we conducted a 48 hour speed study from August 3rd – 5th, 2015 on Gurley Ave. with the traffic data collectors having been located just south of 5th St. on South Gurley Avenue. The analysis of this information is typically a first step in determining the extent of speeding infractions within a segment of roadway, and in determining the most effective plan of action to address those concerns. During the two days of data collection, 12,523 data/speed points were collected.

The “85th percentile speed” is a common marker within this data and is used to establish regulatory speeds throughout many states and cities (including Wyoming and Gillette). This is the speed at or below which 85% of all vehicles are observed to travel. Our data shows that for northbound traffic, the 85th percentile speed was 33mph, and for southbound traffic, 34mph. Although outside the posted speed limit of 30mph, these are customary numbers to observe in relation to the established speed limit, road classification, property uses along the roadway, roadway conditions, etc., keeping in mind that only 15% of vehicles are traveling faster than these speeds. The 95th percentile speeds were 34mph for northbound traffic and 37mph for southbound traffic, which means only 5% of traffic was exceeding these speeds.

In relation to the specific request for fixed radar speed displays, the Engineering Division has exercised reservations in other recent requests for placement of these signs on the transportation system. With compliance being the primary objective, we feel that (depending on specific circumstances) there are often other efficient, cost effective means to accomplish heightened speed awareness for motorists.

Previous experience with display signs have proven to cause for high initial costs, excessive maintenance costs, intermittent accuracy and frequent calibration of the displays. Some brief data below helps to offer information on varying costs:

- Radar Speed Displays - \$3,000-\$5,000
- Amber warning beacon (solar powered) - \$1,500-\$1,800
- Customary Speed Limit Sign with post - \$150-\$200

With the City’s nearly 175 regulatory speed limit signs currently in place, another real concern is the likelihood for increased requests for the radar speed displays, and then subsequently, a fair, consistent, and measurable means to determine whether to fulfill such requests.

Recommendation:

To help resolve the concerns with this location, we would like to work with P.D. on targeted or directed patrols of this specific stretch of Gurley Ave., temporary placement of the City’s Portable Radar Signs, or consideration of installing a solar powered warning beacon atop the existing southbound static speed limit sign. The data suggests that southbound through traffic carries some speed off of the Gurley Overpass.

In response to concern presented by Councilman McGrath relating to a truck parked east of North Gurley Avenue which appears to be used for advertising purposes only at this time, staff has contacted the owner of the truck and is working with them to get the issue resolved. The truck is typically used during the construction of homes to store materials, however the construction in the immediate area appears to be complete. As such, the truck is not being used for its intended use and appears to be parked in a manner to advertise business, therefore it is considered illegal advertising in accordance with Section 10 of the Zoning Ordinance. The owner has been directed to use the truck for its intended purpose or remove it from that location.

Staff is also working on similar issues on Butler Spaeth Road and Highway 59.

This is a brief letter of interest stating the Farmer's Cooperative Association's (hereby FCA) intent to pursue a City of Gillette Liquor License

Legal Description

The FCA was incorporated in 1928 and continues to be a locally owned and operated corporation. The FCA is currently governed by an 8-member board consisting of Class A members from Campbell and Crook Counties in Wyoming and Powder River County in Montana. Per by-laws, the FCA is audited at minimum once a year and profits are distributed to its members. Over the last three years FCA has returned member patronage of almost \$2.2 million, of which 30% was in cash.

Business Plan

In 2012, the governing board voted to expand operations by selecting a new site for a Travel Plaza. The FCA purchased a 7-acre lot (in two sections) at the intersection of Boxelder Drive and Garner Lake Road. Currently the FCA is erecting a \$6 million facility encompassing two canopies, 1 with gasoline products and 1 with diesel/DEF products, a truck scale, an RV dump station and a 6,000

square foot building with a fast casual food service. Our primary goal has been to provide easy access for big rigs – RV's, horse trailers, work trailers and trucks. At the request of the City of Gillette we engaged DOWL Engineering to complete a comprehensive Traffic Study to determine location of driveways and the impact of traffic at the site. We have 4,000 square feet to the NW of the current building for future growth and a possible drive-thru. We believe that this area will continue to grow as Gillette expands along the Boxelder corridor.

We feel this site to be an ideal location for a package retail liquor site as it will not impede traffic and will provide services to an as of yet un-serviced area of Gillette and Campbell County. Our current contract with Hladky Construction calls for an October 31st completion date and as of July 27, 2015 they are on schedule. Consultation with Scott Heibult of Hladky Construction and Brandon Scott of Scott Brothers Electrical have initially indicated minor changes could accommodate a package liquor site at this time.

Our project is being financed by CoBank, an agricultural lender, with a total of \$8.0 million funds available. Currently, we are within our budget of \$6.1 million.

Walmart Stores, Inc. ("Walmart") is pleased to submit its Letter of Interest for the Retail Liquor License pursuant to the Gillette City Council Resolution No 2526 Provided herewith is the information requested by the City Clerk prior to submittal of an application.

Walmart Supercenter # 1485 in Gillette provides a one-stop shopping experience that is perfect for stock-up trips. Our store offers electronics, apparel, pharmacy and home furnishings, with the added convenience of a full line of groceries, including fresh produce, a bakery and deli meat and dairy products and dry goods. This store measures just under 207,000 square feet and employs approximately 385 associates.

I. Name and Contact Information for the Applicant.

The name of the applicant is Walmart Stores, Inc. The address of the store where the liquor license will be located is 2300 S. Douglas HWY, Gillette, WY, 82718. The Store Manager of the Walmart in Gillette is Robert Johnson, who may be contacted at (307) 686-4060. The mailing address for Walmart is 702 SW 8th Street, Bentonville, AR 72716-0500. Wal-Mart is publicly traded on the New York Stock Exchange

II. A description of the type of business entity that is intended to hold the license, including copies of organizational documents.

We're committed to building strong communities where we operate. Walmart has been a part of Gillette since 1991, investing as an employer, contributing to the economy and serving the people of the community Through property and other business taxes, we have supported the city and state with over \$21,000,000 paid in taxes in our last five years of operations. In 2014, Walmart and Sam's Club spent approximately \$14.7 million with Wyoming suppliers and supported more than 2,430 jobs with those businesses. We're also proud of the jobs and opportunities we offer our associates. The Gillette store has 130 associates that have been with the company for five or more years, including 16 associates with more than 20 years.



Store managers and associates are empowered to be directly involved with local nonprofits, schools, and institutions, as well as invest in local causes. Over the last five years, our store and its associates have:

- Volunteered more than 2,500 hours
- Provided \$90,000 in grants to local nonprofits
- Given more than 740,000 pounds of food to local food banks

As a retailer, Walmart is committed to the responsible sale of adult beverages and does so in all stores where we sell restricted products. The company has a strong track-record in Wyoming at its four stores which operate with a liquor license. Associates receive intensive and regular training and are supported by our in-store security teams, who are also highly trained with many having backgrounds in law enforcement. Nationally, we have worked with the Foundation for Advancing Alcohol Responsibility, an organization focused on eliminating underage drinking and drunk driving.

III. A business plan, including a brief operation plan.

A. Schedule of Hours of Operation

Wal-Mart intends to maintain hours of operation seven (7) days per week and during the hours permitted under the laws of the State of Wyoming and Ordinances of the City of Gillette

B. Intended Uses of the Facility:

Wal-Mart will use the facility for the sale of package liquor. It will not maintain a pour area in its establishment. As depicted by the architectural renderings attached hereto, if Wal-Mart is fortunate enough to obtain a retail liquor license, it intends to isolate the package sales area in a liquor box constructed to the City of Gillette's standards just South of the front entrance way. This will allow exclusive exit/entrance for customers to the outside and not through the inside of the store. The customer entrance to the sales area will be from the exterior of the building and no customer entrance from within the existing Wal-Mart store will exist. No person under the age of twenty-one will (21) will be permitted to enter unless accompanied by a parent or guardian

C. Alcohol Management:

Wal-Mart will sell package liquor to the public. Currently, Wal-Mart's stores in Cody, Riverton, Laramie and Casper all sell package liquor to the public. Wal-Mart maintains a "zero tolerance" policy on all age restricted products. To ensure compliance with the policy, any age-restricted products (including alcohol) automatically triggers a lock on the cash register until a valid birth date is entered. Furthermore, all sales associates are trained to check identification and any associate who sells to a customer that does not appear to be over 40 years of age without checking identification is subject to termination. Attached is a flow diagram which demonstrates a typical transaction involving the sale of an adult beverage and the safeguards that are in place to ensure a responsible sale.

D. Crowd Control:

Since the establishment will only sell package liquor for consumption off the premises, there will be no accumulation of crowds at the location of the alcohol sales.



E. Security:

Wal-Mart requires all alcohol to be paid for in the liquor area of the store only. Cameras are located throughout the store and in the parking lot area, including at all existing entrances and exits in the building. Walmart will train all associates who sell alcohol on how to properly check identification and how to identify intoxicated individuals to whom Wal-Mart will not sell alcohol. Walmart also has two employees assigned to asset protection for the facility.

IV. The intended location of the business, and a general description of the building to be used in the operation of the business.

The Retail Liquor License will be used at the Wal-Mart located at 2300 S Douglas HWY, Gillette, WY 82718. The current drafts of architectural renderings of the separate and distinct location within the store are attached hereto. *** Please note that these renderings are not final and are subject to change. Walmart plans to work with the necessary city officials to reach agreement on plans that will meet applicable city code requirements**.*

V. The anticipated time necessary to have the license in operation at the proposed location.

Wal-Mart anticipates that it will take approximately six months to complete the creation of the separate liquor box in the store.

VI. Financial Information sufficient to show that Wal-Mart is capable of completing the project.

Wal-Mart's Form 10-Q for the Quarterly Period Ending April 30, 2015 is also attached to this letter. The form 10-Q shows that Wal-Mart is in a solid financial position, with over \$100 Billion Gross Profit in 2014. Wal-Mart was founded in 1962, incorporated in 1969, and has operated as a successful business since inception. The Form 10-Q confirms Wal-Mart possesses the assets necessary to complete this project.




