

Commission, and additional regulatory approvals are in process.





The name certainly grabs your attention, much like it did for those making their way along the bloody Bozeman Trail in the mid-1800s. Crazy Woman Canyon was a point along the dangerous route north, as were Crazy Woman Creek, which flows through the canyon, and the Crazy Woman Battlefield nearby. But it's the canyon, with the eerie name, that is the true landmark here in Powder River/Bighorn Mountain country.

Crazy Woman Canyon is a spectacular sight with high cliffs on both sides, highlighted by an assortment of boulders that have tumbled from above. Like many landmarks and legends from the Wyoming Frontier, even before Territory and long before Statehood days, there are varying stories and theories as to how they took their names. Call them legend or call them fact, there are two such theories for Crazy Woman Canyon. One says it was named for an Indian woman, left to live alone in her teepee here, who went insane. The other tells a tragic and violent tale of the settler who witnessed the capture and scalping of her husband by Indians, which drove her to insanity. Crazy Woman Canyon served as a passageway for centuries for Native Indians. It was a perfect staging area for war parties during the Plains Indian Wars, and one has to wonder how many times some of the local outlaws in the late 1800s might have used the canyon to aid in a getaway or two. It's a beautiful stone landmark with a lot of history and a little insanity, at Crazy Woman Canyon.





Located 7 miles north of Gillette, Wyoming, the Dry Fork Station is a new coal-based electric generation power plant owned by Basin Electric Power Cooperative (92.9 percent), and the Wyoming Municipal Power Agency, Lusk, Wyoming (7.1 percent). Construction on the Dry Fork Station began in 2007, more than three years after the plant was announced. The workforce peaked at about 1,300 in 2009. Among many significant milestones, the safety record during construction included more than 6 million man hours worked without a lost-time accident. Dry Fork Station was dedicated on August 11, 2011.

The Cordero Rojo Mine is located approximately 25 miles south of Gillette, Wyoming. The mine extracts thermal coal from the Wyodak Seam, which ranges from approximately 55 to 70 feet in thickness. Cordero Rojo mined and shipped approximately 34.8 million tons of low sulfur coal in 2014. Coal mined from Cordero Rojo is primarily shipped to electric utilities in the west, midwest and southeast United States. Cordero Rojo Mine recently won the 2015 State of Wyoming Reclamation Award from the Department of Environmental Quality, Land Quality Division, for the successful restoration of the Belle Fourche River.




In follow up to the inquiry from Councilman Barks regarding trailer-mounted signs within the City, we offer the following information to the Mayor and City Council:

Section 10 of the City of Gillette Zoning Ordinance outlines the regulations for sign placements within the City. Under subsection (d), part 4, Prohibited Signs, we have the following language;

"No person shall park any vehicle or trailer on a public right-of-way or public property, or on private property, so as to be visible from the public right-of-way, which has attached thereto or located thereon any sign or advertising device for the basic purpose of providing advertisement of products or directing people to a business or activity located on the same or nearby property or any other premises."

In response to the specific case along Lakeway Rd, Development Services staff have recently been made aware of the sign and are in the process of addressing the Zoning Ordinance infraction with the owner(s). There is another similar sign along a development on the west side of Butler Spaeth Rd (south of Lakeway intersection) that we will be looking into as well. We plan to send formal notice of the Zoning regulations to the owners for their prompt action in removing the non-compliant signing.

Dear President Becker:

On behalf of the City of Gillette and the City of Douglas, I am writing in response to the letter submitted to Senate Majority Leader McConnell and Minority Leader Reid regarding the National League of Cities support for the negotiation of an international climate agreement during the United Nations Conference of Parties (COP-21). We do not support the negotiations, especially those points based on the U.S. EPA's Clean Power Plan.

The Clean Power Plan (CPP) has raised many serious questions that could affect the way electricity and energy is produced and consumed in the United States, and until these questions are answered, we do not believe that it should be supported. Some of these serious issues with the CPP are:

- It threatens to raise rates, especially on those that can least afford it.
- It threatens reliability of the energy grid.
- The CPP goes beyond the authority granted to the EPA in the Clean Air Act.
- It is overly complex, which again threatens the reliability of the energy grid.
- It will prematurely close power plants, killing jobs.

The CPP also does not address the strides that are being made in the field of carbon capture and sequestration that not only allow coal fired power plants to reduce their CO₂ emissions, but also gives companies an opportunity to use the captured carbon dioxide into commercially viable products. Wyoming Governor Matt Mead has proposed a Carbon Capture research project competition with the support of the Wyoming legislature and in Collaboration with X-Prize. This will give companies a facility to do the research necessary to find ways to use the carbon dioxide produced in an environmentally safe manner.

Coal has been the cheapest, most reliable source of electricity for our nation. It fueled the Industrial Revolution that made the United States into the world power it is today. With advances in carbon capture and sequestration technology as well as new ideas for the use of the captured CO₂, coal can and will continue to be a readily available, low-cost portion of the overall energy mix of the United States.

Thank you for your letter addressing concerns you have with NLC's support for an international agreement on climate change during the upcoming United Nations Conference of Parties in Paris in December (COP21). I will make sure that the letter reaches NLC leadership.

NLC will be sending a delegation of local elected officials to the U.N. meeting to highlight the many actions that cities and towns of all sizes across the country are taking to mitigate the impacts of climate change. As you know, cities are on the front lines of responding to these impacts and have been leading the way adopting climate action/sustainability plans.

The NLC position on climate change mitigation and adaptation is clear. NLC supports "a multi-pollutant strategy to reduce emissions from power plants, mobile sources and other major sources to provide significant reductions in greenhouse gas emissions." NLC policy supports energy efficiency programs and renewable energy, as well as the use of clean coal technology. As members of the NLC Energy, Environment and Natural Resources Committee, I know you can appreciate the process by which this policy was developed in the committee and approved by the NLC membership. Regarding the EPA Clean Power Plan, I understand that the state-specific targets will have different impacts on the communities in those states as they work toward meeting the goal.
