## Intent of Notification (Maintenance and Overlay Projects)

Your company is being notified of this project due to one and/or more of the following conditions:

- Our Utilities License Database indicates that your company has facilities located in this area of proposed construction. A copy of the report is attached for your reference.
- Our field inspection of the proposed project found facilities in the project area that were not listed in our Utilities License Database but are located inside public rights-of-way. Wyoming Statute §1-26-813 requires that permission be obtained from the Department prior to constructing any utility facilities along, across, or under the streets, roads, and highways under the Department jurisdiction.
- Your company has no mapped utilities shown on the plans, but your company's services cover the general area of the project.

The Department is notifying you now to provide sufficient warning of an upcoming project for planning and budgeting purposes, as well as an opportunity to come into compliance with State laws for unlicensed facilities if applicable.

### **Overlay Projects**

As WYDOT maintains its roadways with the use of overlays, the addition of paving material will reduce the vertical clearance of existing overhead utility facilities. With this notification WYDOT is requesting that your company inspect its facilities in the project area and ensure compliance with the minimum vertical clearance per our regulation and associated stipulations effective July 2009:

*The minimum clearance for any conductor or cable within state and federal highway rights-of-way shall be 25'-6" computed at maximum conductor or cable sag.*

Facilities previously constructed with the old eighteen (18) foot clearance will be grandfathered if the line does not require adjustment to meet that clearance on this project. If the line requires adjustment because of this project the line will be raised to the new clearance requirement.

### **WYDOT Utilities Database Reports**

If available, a listing of known facility licenses and agreements found within the project area from our Utilities License Database is attached for your reference. The code used to identify your company's listings in the Database is shown to the left of your address block on the *Address List* attached to this letter. Also enclosed is a *WYDOT Utilities Database Legend* which describes the *Facilities Type* and *Encroachment Type* abbreviations used on the report.

### **Non reimbursable work**

Crossings of the highway by overhead facilities where only the vertical clearance is in conflict are not considered reimbursable. This would include the necessity of having to place higher poles to achieve the mandated clearance. Any adjustment work required for existing utility facilities that are located on/inside public right-of-way will be accomplished at "Company" expense, unless otherwise provided for by law.

### **Reimbursable work**

Conflicts affecting the utility company's property interest, such as, areas that are outside public right-of-way, or a line that was in existence prior to the building of the roadway in private easement are included in the definition of reimbursable work. When work by the Department in additional R/W or construction permit procurement causes a pole that was previously located on private property to require relocation due to steep slopes, excavation, culvert installation, etc., then those costs may be reimbursable.

If reimbursable conflicts are discovered, please contact this office in writing, as soon as possible to allow sufficient time for the agreement process. In your letter, please detail the conflict area by highway station; include a copy of your easement or instrument documenting the prior right, a plan drawing of the work, and an estimate of the cost. Thank you.






**GENERAL NOTES**

**SPECIFICATIONS:** WYDOT Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction, 2010 Edition

**DIMENSIONS:** Longitudinal dimensions are horizontal and include no correction for grade. Slopes are vertical : horizontal.

**FIELD MEASUREMENTS:** Field verify measurements before ordering any materials.

**LINestyle DESIGNATION:** Phantom lines indicate existing structure, solid lines indicate new construction, hatched areas indicate removal.

**CONCRETE:** Use Class A concrete for the bridge deck, use a bridge concrete patching material at all other locations.

**REMOVAL OF CONCRETE:** Remove portions of the existing bridge deck to the limits shown. Do not damage existing concrete to remain in place. Use a 30 LB pneumatic hammer for general removal and a 15 LB pneumatic hammer within 1'-0" of removal limits. Do not use larger removal equipment unless approved by the State Bridge Engineer.

Thoroughly clean concrete from reinforcing steel and straighten as required. Remove and replace damaged reinforcing steel with the same size bar and weld-splice or mechanically splice where necessary at no additional cost to the department.

**HAZARDOUS MATERIALS:** The paint system on the steel components of the existing structures contains materials including lead and chromium that are hazardous if ingested, inhaled, or otherwise absorbed.

**SLAB REMOVAL:** Ensure all slab removal operations are in accordance with Special Provision SP-2005N, Concrete Bridge Deck Removal

**EPOXY RESIN INJECTION:** After heat straightening, inject the gap between the bottom of the slab and the top of the girder flange with an epoxy resin injection material in accordance with the WYDOT 2010 Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction, Section 627, Epoxy Resin Injection.

**STRUCTURAL STEEL:** Ensure structural steel conforms to ASTM A 709 (Grade 36) and structural pipe conforms to ASTM A 53 (Grade B) unless noted. Ensure steel fabricators supplying structural components are certified under the AISC Certification Program for Structural Steel Fabricators, Standard for Steel Bridges - 2011, Category X [Simple Bridges or Intermediate Bridges].

**EPOXY RESIN BONDING COMPOUND:** Clean the roughened surfaces of the existing concrete at spill locations, and coat with epoxy resin bonding compound. Place new concrete immediately after applying the bonding compound. If the bonding compound gels before concrete placement, remove by sandblasting and reapply. Mix and apply in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations. Work necessary for the epoxy resin bonding compound is incidental to the contract pay item Class A Concrete.

Do not use epoxy resin bonding compound for deck repairs.

**CONCRETE AGGREGATE:** Ensure all concrete mix designs employed in the project meet the following alkali-silica reactivity (ASR) screening.

Test concrete aggregate in accordance with AASHTO T303-04 (ASTM C1260-07) Accelerated Detection of Potentially Deleterious Expansion of Mortar Bars Due to Alkali-Silica Reaction or when fly ash or silica fume is used in the mix, ASTM C1567-08 Standard Test Method for Determining the Potential Alkali-Silica Reactivity of Combinations of Cementitious Materials and Aggregate (Accelerated Mortar-Bar Method).

Conduct the AASHTO T303 (ASTM C1260) or ASTM C1567 test using a combined sample of fine aggregate and coarse aggregate, in the same proportions that will be used in the concrete mix design and using the cementitious material that is to be used in final concrete mix design.

Ensure the test results indicate an expansion at 16 calendar days from casting of 0.10 percent or less.

Mitigate sources which indicate reactive though the use of a Class F fly ash approved for ASR mitigation in accordance with the Materials Testing Manual, silica fume and/or lithium nitrate additive. Ensure the AASHTO T303 (ASTM C1260) and ASTM C1567 tests are performed within 12 months before the submittal date. The department's Materials Program maintains the option to conduct AASHTO T303 (ASTM C1260) and ASTM C1567 testing for verification.

Submit qualifying AASHTO T303 (ASTM C1260) and ASTM C1567 test results to the engineer a minimum of 14 calendar days before concrete production. Submit test results to the Materials Program along with each mix design request.

**HAZARDOUS MATERIALS:** Paint the following areas of structural steel:

- New stiffeners, cross frames, and bolts.
- Existing girders within limits of heat straightening.


The paint system on the steel components of the existing structure contains materials including lead and chromium that are hazardous if ingested, inhaled, or otherwise absorbed.

Paint areas of the existing structural steel in accordance with Subsection 501.4.2.8, Field Painting. Collect and contain all rags and rinse water used for surface preparation as specified for "other debris" in accordance with Supplementary Specification 55-100G, Worker and Environmental Controls for Lead Paint Removal. Use a green top color for the structural steel.


**FALSEWORK/SHORING:** For bearing device modification, submit design computations and plans for the falsework/ shoring and jacking plans in accordance with SP-500VL, Bearing Device Modification, for supporting the girders during the Bearing Device Modification. Ensure the design computations and plans are prepared under the supervision of a professional engineer and the title pages of the design computations and plans bear the seal and signature of the professional engineer. Ensure design computations and plans for falsework/shoring are submitted to the engineer a minimum of 7 calendar days before erection. The professional engineer will inspect and provide written certification of compliance with the design and plans for completed falsework/shoring to the engineer before jacking the girders.

**BRIDGE OFFICE NOTIFICATION:** The engineer will notify the State Bridge Engineer in writing within 14 calendar days after the rehabilitation work has been completed at each structure.




**DAMAGE LOCATION PLAN**


**SECTION AT POINT OF IMPACT: GIRDER NO. 2**






STIFFENER NOS. 2, 12 & 13, 15-18


**CROSS FRAME REPLACEMENT ELEVATION: TYPE A**


**CROSS FRAME REPLACEMENT ELEVATION: TYPE B**






**SECTION B-B**




**TYPICAL SHEAR STUD DETAIL**

- 1) Remove existing deck to the limits shown and inspect for damaged shear studs. Replace shear studs as necessary and reconstruct to existing lines of construction with class A concrete.
  - 2) Perform concrete repairs in accordance with Supplementary Specification 55-500J, Bridge Concrete Repair. Repair with concrete repair material except in locations where class A concrete is indicated.
  - 3) The estimated quantity of class A concrete for shear stud inspections is 0.8 CY.
  - 4) For locations of damage repairs, see Sheet No. 3.




**LOCATIONS 1, 2 & 3: TYPICAL SECTION AT SPALL**








**LOCATION 5: EXPANSION BEARING AT BENT**

## Energy Impacts

The past year was historic for United States energy interests, including the downward spiral of coal and the continued decline of natural gas and oil prices.

- 2015 was extremely stressful for the Coal Mining Industry in the Powder River Basin as a result of increased regulation and declining demand for coal.
- Natural gas prices remain at historic lows.
- Contrast to 2014, oil development in the Powder River Basin slowed dramatically in 2015.
- At the end of 2015 the price of oil dropped to nearly \$30 per barrel after experiencing over \$100 per barrel in early 2014.

**The decrease in activity associated with the energy industry in Campbell County and the Powder River Basin impacted Gillette's growth and development trends in 2015.**







Campbell County Voters approved the Optional 1% Sales Tax during the 2014 General Election for another four years. The Optional 1% Sales Tax generates approximately \$30M on an annual basis and is used for public capital improvement projects throughout Campbell County. The Optional 1% Sales Tax Revenue is distributed to the City of Gillette, Town of Wright and unincorporated Campbell County on a population basis. Several of the aforementioned projects were funded by the Optional 1% Sales Tax.

(Expansion of the existing CCHS South Campus)

During a special election on May 3, 2011, Campbell County Voters approved an additional one percent (1%) specific purpose excise tax (Capital Facilities Tax) in the amount of \$110M to pay for a portion of water system improvements for the Gillette Regional Water System and other water system improvements in Wright. During the first quarter of 2015, the entire \$110M amount had been collected resulting in the total sales tax assessment in Campbell County decreasing from 6% to 5%.

Major construction contracts associated with the Gillette Regional Water Supply Project, either completed or ongoing in 2015 include:

- Completion of the 42-inch Transmission Main between Wyodak and Moorcroft
- Completion of water transmission/distribution improvements near Pine Ridge in Crook County
- Construction of the new water treatment facility near Pine Ridge in Crook County
- Construction of the new water transmission pumping facility near Rozet
- Construction of regional water line extensions for the Force Road and Cook Road areas
- Start construction of three additional wells near Pine Ridge in Crook County

## **WyoLotto pays off loan, set to transfer revenue**

### **Cheyenne, Wyoming**

January 30, 2016 – With its final payment of \$25,000 on January 30, the Wyoming Lottery Corporation has paid off its \$2.6 million startup loan and announced that its first revenue transfer to the state coffers will be \$1 million in April.

“We are officially debt free,” announced Jon Clontz, CEO of the Wyoming Lottery Corporation at a small celebration held at the lottery headquarters in downtown Cheyenne.

“Our \$2.6 million loan allowed the lottery to start up the corporation. With ticket sales through Wyoming’s own game and other draw games, we were able to start developing a new state revenue stream for cities, towns, counties, and education as soon as that loan was paid off,” Clontz said. “Doing this all without state funding in less than a year and half of ticket sales is quite an accomplishment, especially taking into account the state’s small population and that we were only authorized to sell draw games.”

Clontz explained that the loan payoff and the April revenue transfer happened faster than originally expected due to increased ticket sales for the recent \$1.6 billion Powerball® jackpot and last year’s launch of the popular Cowboy Draw™ game, which offers better odds and more winners.

“Growing the lottery’s player base and adding new games are crucial to the lottery’s ability to transfer more revenue to the state,” Clontz said. “If we don’t see more growth, then the next revenue transfer will be much lower.”

In order to grow revenue, the lottery will continue to research new draw game options allowed under state statute. “We will present that research to our board with the hopes of adding, at least, one new draw game by the fall of 2016,” Clontz added.

In the meantime, the lottery will turn over its first revenue transfer of at least \$1 million to the Wyoming Treasurer’s Office, which will be distributed to the 99 cities and towns and 23 counties, according to the formula in the state statute. Additional payments will then follow once every quarter, up to a maximum of \$6 million per year. Any revenues exceeding that will then go to the Wyoming Permanent Land Fund’s Common School Account.

Clontz emphasized additional milestones reached by the lottery. “Beyond being debt free and transferring revenue to the state, we have been able to keep Wyoming players’ dollars in Wyoming, spent at Wyoming retailers.”

So far over one million WyoLotto™ players have won \$11 million. The new game, Cowboy Draw, increased player excitement with better odds, more winners, and six jackpots won since its launch in March 2015.

The 441 Wyoming retailers selling tickets are also seeing a boost with an average of \$300 to \$1,000 in ticket sales a day. And when jackpots are high, like the recent \$1.6 billion Powerball jackpot, one Wyoming retailer sold \$29,000 worth of tickets in a day.

Ticket sales translate into commission for the retailers, who receive a six percent commission on ticket sales and a one percent commission on validated winning tickets in store. So far, the lottery has paid \$2.38 million in commissions to retailers, who have sold a total of \$39.3 million of lottery tickets.

Clontz emphasized that keeping lottery players in Wyoming keeps revenue here. "Research shows that players usually purchase other products when they go in to buy lottery tickets in store."

The top five selling counties were Uinta County at \$8.2 million in ticket sales, Natrona County at \$5.2 million, Laramie County at \$5.1 million, Sweetwater County at \$3.7 million, and Campbell County at \$3.1 million. Please see the chart below for a breakdown of ticket sales by county.

Clontz added, "The Wyoming Lottery is a Wyoming brand and is very proud to be a part of Wyoming's unique culture. We are working hard to continue to contribute to the state's economy."



## The International Code Council® (ICC®)

The International Code Council is a member-focused association dedicated to helping the building safety community and construction industry provide safe and sustainable construction through the development of codes and standards used in the design, build and compliance process. Most U.S. communities and many global markets choose the International Codes.



The Code Council is a not-for-profit association. Many of its Members represent federal, state and local governmental jurisdictions. Individual Members include architects, engineers, designers, builders, contractors and others from the public, private and corporate sectors.

The ICC develops model construction codes (known as the International Codes or I-Codes) and standards that address commercial and residential buildings, safety and sustainability, fire prevention, energy conservation, plumbing, mechanical and fuel gas systems, existing buildings, and swimming pool and spa safety. The ICC also trains and certifies our nation's builders, building trades and code enforcement officials to ensure that effective code compliance is achieved.



ICC values its partnerships with technical schools around the country. The Code Council supports and provides nationally recognized levels of achievement to students learning the building trades. This will help prepare them for obtaining an ICC certification that will assist them in starting their careers in the building industry.

### Why Should a Technical High School join the ICC?

All 50 states and the District of Columbia enforce the I-Codes at either the state or jurisdictional level. The I-Codes are used in the design and construction of residential, commercial, federal and military facilities. The building trades are a very important component of the construction industry. ICC supports and encourages technical high schools to offer young people entering the workforce the tools and knowledge necessary to succeed. By joining with the ICC the school will provide students with an excellent academic education combined with technical code training that will go hand-in-hand with practical training for the workplace. Additionally, through the ICC website schools will have access to the ICC Evaluation Services and evaluation reports along with current updates related to the latest construction materials. This educational combination will allow students to enter the construction trades with an advantage that will expand their career growth opportunities anywhere in the country. Having a technical code background opens the door to opportunities in careers in code administration. From any building trade, the student may transition into the field of inspections, building, electrical, plumbing, mechanical, fire, public works, property maintenance and more.

The ICC's National Certification Program for code professionals has been established to provide our Members with an extensive array of certifications in virtually every field related to the construction industry. ICC has awarded more than 500,000 certifications. Many employers require inspectors to have worked in the construction trades, completed an apprenticeship program, studied engineering or architecture, or have an Associate's degree from a community college in construction technology, blueprint reading, or building inspection. Certification enhances the student's chances for higher paying, higher responsibility jobs.

All ICC Members receive reduced prices on code books, related workbooks, study companions and code commentaries in our online store and reduced prices for on-line courses available through ICC's On-line Campus. In addition, all ICC Members are urged to view the code development process in person or online to review pending code changes as well as submit requests for code changes or a new code requirement through the ICC governmental consensus code development process.

## Technical Training and the I-Codes

In 2009, a pilot program was started at Harford Technical High School in Bel Air, Maryland, to introduce students to the residential code and how it is applied to the actual construction of a Habitat for Humanity home. Students and instructors referenced the International Residential Code (IRC) as they progressed through the construction of the home to help ensure they were manufacturing it in compliance with building codes enforced within the jurisdiction. During this process, and under the guidance of their instructors, students reviewed the IRC code book along with the accompanying IRC Study Companion and began taking the practice exams in the Companion in anticipation of receiving an ICC Certificate of Achievement.

Using this technique of hands-on construction, paired with review and understanding of various codes involved with residential construction, the students were introduced to the codes and obtained better comprehension of how residential construction and building codes work hand in hand to produce a strong, durable and safe structure.

## The Certificate of Achievement (COA)

The International Code Council has established a Certificate of Achievement to recognize a Technical High School student's achievement of successfully completing all program elements and passing an hour-long test containing 30 questions pertaining to a specific trade—Building, Electrical, Plumbing or HVAC. Students may have the opportunity to attain one or all four Certificates of Achievement during their school years. If a student receives all four certificates during their high school career they will be better prepared to sit for various IRC Inspectors Certification exams, which are requirements in most jurisdictions to obtain a residential building inspector position. The students can take inspectors tests for each discipline; they are not limited to residential.






## INTERNATIONAL RESIDENTIAL CODE ADOPTION MAP




