I'm following up to Councilman Carsrud's report of a pedestrian clock not working correctly at the intersection of Brooks and Hwy 14/16. After receiving further clarification from Councilman Carsrud on the details of the issue, it appears to be a malfunction in the pedestrian signal head for the pedestrians crossing Brooks on the north leg of the intersection (countdown clock is stuck at 11 seconds). I've had Rick Eddy (City Traffic Safety Technician) look into the issue and contact WYDOT to correct the situation. (The traffic signal at Brooks and 14/16 is owned and maintained by WYDOT.) Rick was able to make contact with the WYDOT technician and he was going to follow up with it. We will follow up with them in a week or so to confirm their repair. Thank you.



Clean Power Plan Case Heard Before the U.S. Court of Appeals

CHEYENNE, Wyo. – Wyoming and 26 other states, industry groups and others presented arguments before the D.C. Circuit Court of Appeals on Tuesday in opposition to the Clean Power Plan. The states argued the proposed rule goes far beyond the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) authority. Wyoming would be particularly impacted as the rule requires the state to reduce its carbon dioxide emissions by 44%.

"Federal regulatory agencies continue to push the boundaries of their legal authority. This results in unreasonable and onerous burdens on industry, businesses, individuals and states," said Governor Matt Mead. "The Clean Power Plan is just such a situation. I am pleased the Court stopped the implementation of the rule pending a decision in this case."

Earlier this year, the D.C. Circuit denied a petition from states to halt implementation of the rule while litigation was pending. The petition was then submitted to the U.S. Supreme Court which ultimately granted the stay and stopped implementation of the rule. The petition argued the EPA did not have the proper authority, the Clean Power Plan would take authority away from states to regulate in-state power generation and transmission and the final rule was substantially different from its draft version, a violation of the Administrative Procedure Act.

For the first time since we've been tracking LODDs, the number of heart attacks this month is not the top cause of deaths. Apparatus crashes killed 5 compared to 3 heart attacks.

HISTORY:

From the Sept. 1, 1921 *Gillette News*:

Fire came near destroying the home of Lewis Clegg in east Gillette on Tuesday night. Mr. and Mrs. Clegg had gone for a little joy ride and left the oil stove burning. Just what happened is not known, but when the fire was discovered, the interior of the room was in flames. The quick response of the fire department and neighbors, the latter removing household effects and the former plying a stream of water on the flames soon quenched the blaze. Mr. Clegg states that some miscreant stole 60 phonograph records and a Winchester repeating rifle during the fire. This is undoubtedly one of the lowest down acts yet perpetrated in Gillette. There seems to be nothing too low for some men to stoop to these days.


What has kept you located in Gillette? Being hired with CCFD brought me back to Gillette and a lot of my family lives here as well.

Food? - Depends on my mood, I will tell you that I love to cook




Wag'N O2 Fur Life Pet Oxygen Mask Kit - Pet Rescue Mask Kit

We have some great firefighters within our department, but we also have some wonderful families too! Cindi Shank, wife of Fire Chief Shank is assisting in trying to provide our department with pet oxygen mask kits. Please see her message below:

Currently, our local fire department doesn't have the equipment to help pets that could be affected by a house fire. Unlike humans that run out of a fire, pets usually hide in the structure because they're frightened. Our firefighters save people as well as pets! Traditional human oxygen masks may not always work well on animals and there are ready made kits you can purchase on Amazon that has everything the firefighters need to help a pet in distress after a fire. The cost of the kits are \$120 each. (<https://www.amazon.com/WagN-O2-Fur-Life-Oxygen>) Campbell County has 11 fire engines that could use these kits.

RECIPE OF THE MONTH:

PUMPKIN PECAN COBBLER

Yield: 8 servings

Prep Time: 10 minutes

Cook Time: 40 minutes

Total Time: 50 minutes

INGREDIENTS:

1 cup + 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour

2 teaspoons baking powder

1/2 teaspoon salt

3/4 cup granulated sugar

1 teaspoon cinnamon

1/2 teaspoon nutmeg

1/2 teaspoon cloves

1/2 cup pumpkin puree

1/4 cup milk

1/4 cup melted butter or vegetable oil

1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla

topping:

1/2 cup granulated sugar

1/2 cup brown sugar

1/4 cup chopped pecans

1 1/2 cups very hot water


DIRECTIONS:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

In a medium sized bowl, stir together flour, baking powder, salt, sugar and spices. Set aside.

In a smaller bowl, stir pumpkin, milk, melted butter and vanilla together to combine. Pour wet ingredients into dry ingredients and mix to create a thick batter. Pour into a small 8-inch casserole dish with high sides.


In a separate bowl, stir sugar, brown sugar and pecans together. Spread over the top of the batter evenly. Pour hot water over the entire thing {WITHOUT STIRRING A THING!} and bake for 40 minutes or once the middle is set. {Be sure to place on a baking sheet incase it bubbles over.} Cool 5-10 minutes before serving. Serve with more pecans and vanilla ice cream.



Around Town

Within the next month, Fire Station 7 will become part of a lightning sensor network! Campbell County Emergency Management has been pursuing a source of good lightning data ever since this year's National High School Finals Rodeo at the CamPlex, and on September 19th the county signed a contract with United States Precision Lightning Network. The Joint Powers Fire Board had already agreed on the 16th to the use of Station 7 as the site for the sensor.

After looking at various locations in the county, Station 7 was selected due to the lack of rooftop mounted obstructions. The sensor has to have a clear skyview in all directions and Station 7 turned out to be a perfect site. Station



The sensor isn't much to look at...it's a whip antenna, paired with a small GPS antenna, and the two then connect to a box of electronics which in turn connects to an internet router. When a lightning pulse is detected, the system grabs a precise time from the GPS receiver and shoots it down the internet to the company's servers, which compare that time and other data collected about the lightning bolt with reports from other sensors in other states, and then computes the exact latitude/longitude and type (positive or negative strike).

CCEMA's interest has been interested in real time data...for events like the NHSFR, we want to know where lightning is striking in relation to where people might be outside. This will also be helpful information for when we have fire crews in the field and a storm is moving their direction.

However, the agreement has another major benefit...we'll be able to access the lightning data AFTER the storms...right down to lat/long and types of the strikes...so we will have exact coordinates of positive strikes and can go check well before they've become multi-acre events and someone finally sees the smoke column.

The final, best part of all of this? We're getting it at no cost! It's a five-year site hosting agreement, they provide all the hardware, we provide the site, power from a wall plug, and a connection to the internet, which already is in place at Station 7.




