
RE: Utility Residential Rate Comparison

Storm Event Overview:

On 2/15/2018, the Streets day crew was arriving for their workday when heavy snow began falling. The crew began plowing trouble areas and priority streets. About 10:30 a.m. snowfall became lighter and the day crew was able to keep priority streets clear, except for areas of drifting due to strong winds. The day crew continued working priority and trouble areas until 1:00 p.m., when conditions improved and they were able to begin work on subdivision streets. Day crew continued working on subdivisions and other trouble areas until 7:00 p.m. shift change.

At 7:00 p.m., night crew took over plowing and applying material to trouble areas and subdivision streets. By 11:30 p.m. subdivisions, priority and trouble areas had been plowed and were holding and event 16 was ended.

Storm Event Overview:

On 2/18/2018 the Streets on-call person observed snow falling and knowing that a winter storm was forecasted, began checking streets and bridges for slick conditions. Day crew was called to assist plowing trouble areas and priority streets as snowfall became heavier. The day crew had to keep re-working the priority streets they plowed as continuing snowfall kept covering them over. Day crew plowed priority streets and trouble areas until 7:00 p.m. shift change.

At 7:00 p.m. 2/18/2018, night crew took over and continued trying to plow priority and trouble areas throughout the night. Weather conditions were bad through the night, with low temperatures, falling and blowing snow.

By early morning on 2/19/2018, snow had stopped for a while and the night crew was able to begin some work on subdivision streets before shift change.

On 2/19/2018, day crew was able to focus work on subdivision streets making slow progress against drifting and periodic snowfall. Day crew worked on both priority and subdivision streets until 7:00 p.m. shift change.

Night crew took over at 7:00 p.m. and continued working on subdivisions making good progress once the storm ended. By 4:30 a.m. the night shift had the subdivision streets opened and the snow event was ended.
