Curbside Yard Waste Pickup Begins Monday, April 1st

Have your rollouts to the curb by 7 a.m. on the same day as trash pickup.

The City of Gillette Curbside Yard Waste Pickup program will begin for the season on Monday, April 1st. Have your tan rollout to the curb by 7 a.m. on the same day as trash pickup.

The City of Gillette [Curbside Yard Waste Pickup](#) program will begin for the season on Monday, April 1st. Have your tan rollout to the curb by 7 a.m. on the same day as trash pickup.

The curbside collection of yard waste is an opt-in program where homeowners receive, on a voluntary basis, by subscription only, a 96-gallon tan roll-out to dispose of yard waste.

The tan Yard Waste roll-outs are for only the following: grass clippings, leaves, and woody materials (limbs, brush, and branches). No trash, sod, dirt, or sand should be placed in the roll-out. Please be careful to not overload the roll-out. The roll-out maximum capacity is 300 pounds. Also, the lid must be able to shut.

The Solid Waste division will service the containers weekly on the same day as trash is picked up. Materials collected curbside will be taken to the City of Gillette's [Yard Waste Drop-Off](#) site which is adjacent to the Waste Water Treatment Plant located at 3101 S. Garner Lake Road.

If you would like to participate in the Yard Waste Curbside Collection Program, contact Customer Service at 686-5206. The cost is \$9.60 per month. The program runs from April through November.

Citizens who choose not to participate in the curbside program are asked to transport their Yard Waste materials to the City of Gillette's [Yard Waste Drop-Off](#) site which is adjacent to the Waste Water Treatment Plant located at 3101 S. Garner Lake Road. There is no cost to drop off yard waste.

Snow Event Report #24

Event Start Date: 3/13/2019 Event Start Time: 10:00 a.m.

Storm Event Overview:

With a Blizzard warning in effect on 3/13/2019, day crew members were keeping an eye on weather conditions. About 10:00 a.m., snow began to fall and stick to the roads. Day crew headed out on their routes to apply material and deal with the slick areas developing on the streets.

Day crew continued plowing and applying material as snowfall and wind increased. Weather conditions became worse as the day went on, and the day crew was forced to focus on priority streets. Wind speeds increased, causing snow to drift into and across roads and right of ways. The day crew worked the rest of their shift keeping main priority streets passable. The Solid Waste crew jumped into one-ton plow trucks and pushed into subdivision streets, keeping them passable so people could get home.

The night crew took over at 7:00 p.m. on 3/13 2019, continuing with the goal of keeping priority streets passable. The Parks Division joined the night crew to focus on subdivision streets, continuing the work to keep the streets open. A level three snow emergency was declared at 10:00 p.m. as road conditions became worse.

The storm remained intense into the night with heavy falling and blowing snow. The weather began to ease up during the early morning hours near 2:00 a.m. and night shift was able to re-gain some of the areas they were losing earlier in the night. Night crew fought through the heavy drifting and opened many of the priority streets again. The Parks crew had also been able to keep many subdivision areas plowed setting the stage for faster progress later in the day. By shift change Thursday morning 3/14/2019, most of the priority streets were opened and subdivision trouble areas were being cleared.

Streets day crew and the Solid Waste Division hit the roads at 7:00 a.m. 3/14/2019 with focused intensity building on the progress of the overnight crews. The two daytime crews pushed through the heavy drifting and finished clearing the priority streets. The level three snow emergency was ended at 9:00 a.m. Efforts then zeroed in on trouble streets and subdivisions. Tandem plows, one tons and loaders were used to clear the remaining streets. The trucks and equipment often had to work in pairs to move and pile the snow to avoid blocking driveways or storm drains. As the day progressed the sunshine and warming temperature began to melt and loosen snow from roadways. The Streets day crew and Solid Waste employees were finally able to finish clearing streets and the event was ended at 6:00 p.m. 3/14/2019.
