RE: BigIron Auction Results

The City just completed the last Big Iron auction for the fiscal year and we received very favorable results once again. The auction began May 23rd and ended June 12th, and we included the three Fire Department command vehicles in our auction. Included in the auction were eight City vehicles including a garbage truck, some police cars, an Animal Control Van, and a few pickups. Also auctioned were several miscellaneous tailgates, bumpers, and other pieces of equipment.

For the first time in our history, we decided to include our old 2 ½ and 3-yard dumpsters. We usually scrap these through Pacific Steel, and get \$12 dollars each for them. We included 80 old dumpsters in the auction (which traditionally would have been worth \$960.00). Below are the results we obtained through the auction.

Geno... could you please push this out to the Council and Mayor?

Campbell County Health is planning a major hospital exercise on Tuesday afternoon, July 23rd, as if a tornado develops and strikes the new addition on the south side of the hospital. This will force evacuation of 30 patients and help them meet some of their licensing requirements.

They're using the new addition area of the building for this as it will be occupied with real patients shortly after the exercise, so they can do this exercise without having to worry about real patients in the area.

In support of their exercise, CCEMA will be activating the EOC for an collaborative exercise. We'll stand the EOC up to a Level 3 (1 or 2 people staffing) probably during the noon hour as a storm "approaches" and push out normal "exercise" weather messages. Once the storm intensifies and then slams into the hospital and does other damages in a short track of 8-10 blocks, we'll activate the EOC to a Level 2 and bring in approximately another five people.

My goal at this point will be to exercise the "worker bees" in the EOC...the four or five functions involving operations, planning, logistics and our PIO(s). I'm also planning on using our GIS Dept to do some mapping using damage assessment reports.

Basically, as initial EOC objectives I am thinking along the lines of (these will be refined and reduced as I work on them):

1. Activation of the EOC to a Level 2 (specifically the planning, logistics, operations and PIO functions)
2. Notification of the Emergency Council, EOC Unified Command, and appropriate state officials. It is not my intent to drag the EC or UC to the EOC...but to have them in the "notification" and then "informational updates" chain. The hospital's exercise will be ending at about the time we'd probably have the EC/UC people at the EOC and beginning their work.
3. Initiating the Gubernatorial approval process for reduced standards of care (or whatever it's called) allowing for emergency temporary transfer of appropriate patients to lesser capable medical facilities. (There is a formal process for this request which involves EMA in the request pipeline)
4. Initiating the Disaster Declaration process. This would never rise to the level of a Presidential Declaration, but I think it's needed as part of that Gubernatorial authorization. Plus, it's always good to practice the paperwork chain.
5. Development of an initial IAP, including mapping.
6. Activation of WebEOC for Situational Awareness and informational updates

7. Initiating damage assessment information collection for affected areas of Gillette.
8. Initiating the resource/needs/requests process, including Red Cross shelters, etc.

We'll also be exercising our Emergency Support Function (ESF) 6 – Medical and ESF 8 – Mass Care

If any of you would like to come to the EOC primarily to observe and maybe “role play” as necessary when declarations are needed, etc...you are more than welcome.

The Mayors, Commission Chair, or in their absence council/commission members would comprise the “Emergency Council” (EC) membership.

The portions of play which would involve the EC will start at 2 p.m. and run through 4 p.m. Realistically, although you'd be getting initial information, we probably wouldn't have EC members at the EOC until at least 1 hour into the event if this was for real. And, we plan on concluding by 4 when the hospital winds down its exercise play..

This will NOT be like last December's exercise...the focus will be on the other end of the room.

Otherwise, we'll still be pushing out exercise messages and you'll receive CodeRED phone calls, emails and text messages...as well as be able to observe or participate if you want on WebEOC (our on-line virtual EOC software).

I'll have additional information as we move closer to the date.



The Wyoming Department of Environmental Quality, Land Quality Division (WDEQ/LQD) has determined that the renewal application of Izita Mine, Permit No. 676, is technically adequate, per W.S. § 35-11-406(h). Four weeks of public notice followed by four weeks of public comment were initiated on May 31, 2019. The public review and comment period will approximately July 22, 2019. A copy of the public notice is attached.

This letter is being sent to you to fulfill the notification requirements of Chapter 12, Section 1 (a) (ii), LQD Coal Rules and Regulations. It is being provided for information purposes and is not a request for review.

Public Notice

The Thunder Basin Coal Company, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company with a mailing address of P.O. Box 406, Wright, WY 82732, has filed a mining permit renewal application with the Land Quality Division of the Department of Environmental Quality for an equipment transport route in Campbell County, Wyoming. The coal mining permit amendment area will be located in:

Township 43N, Range 71W: portions of Sections 1, 2, 12, and 13

Township 44N, Range 71W: portions of Sections 2, 11, 14, 23, 26, and 35

Township 45N, Range 71W: portions of Sections 1, 12, 13, 24, 25, 35, and 36

Township 46N, Range 71W: portions of Sections 24, 25, and 36 Campbell County, Wyoming.

The area is approximately 22 miles in length; the southern boundary of which is approximately 12 miles southeast of the town of Wright, Wyoming. The area extends from the Black Thunder Mine permit area to the Coal Creek Mine permit area and is used for the transfer of mining equipment between these two mines. This area can be found on the Reno Reservoir, Hilight, and Neil Butte USGS quadrangle map(s). Mining activity will occur within 100 feet of Hwy 450, North Lawver Road, South Lawver Road, Keeline Road, Small Road and Shoyer Road.

The original permit to mine was granted on July, 1999 and is estimated to continue until 2045. The land, after mining, will be returned to livestock grazing and wildlife habitat. Information regarding the proposed mining operation and reclamation procedures may be reviewed in the Office of the Land Quality Division of the Department of Environmental Quality in Cheyenne and Sheridan, Wyoming, the office of Thunder Basin Coal Company LLC, 12 miles SE of Wright, WY, or the Campbell County Clerk's Office, Gillette, Wyoming. Written objections to the proposed mining operation must be received by the Administrator of the Land Quality Division, Department of Environmental Quality, 200 W. 17th Street, Suite 10, Cheyenne, WY 82002, before the close of business July 22, 2019. The Director may hold an informal conference if requested, hear the complaint and take action on the application in accordance with the Department's Rules of Practice and Procedure. The complainants shall have a right of appeal to the Environmental Quality Council where the complaint will be heard a second time. A conference shall be held if the Director determines that the nature of the complaint or the position of the complainants indicates that an attempt to informally resolve the disputes is preferable to a contested case proceeding. An informal conference or a public hearing shall be held within twenty (20) days after the final date for filing objections unless a different period is stipulated to by the parties. The Council or Director shall publish notice of the time, date and location of the hearing or conference in a newspaper of general circulation in the locality of the proposed operation once a week for two (2) consecutive weeks immediately prior to the hearing or conference. The hearing would be conducted as a contested case in accordance with the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act (W.S. §16-3-101 through §16-3-115), and the right of judicial review would be afforded as provided in that act. The Wyoming Oil and Gas Commission will be mailed a copy of the application mine plan map as given in W.S. §35-11-406(j).




