





Campbell County Conservation District continues to promote water quality projects in the City of Gillette

If you have seen a storm drain sticker near a street drain, a pet waste disposal sign in a park or saw us sampling the water leaving Gillette Fishing Lake then you know the Campbell County Conservation District (CCCD) is doing their part in promoting the betterment of the water quality in the City of Gillette! These are just some of the projects we continue to be involved in to bring awareness and educate the public of the water quality within the City of Gillette.


The Storm Drain Sticker program began in 2008 and continues today. As of 2018, 2350 stickers have been applied in the City of Gillette. (see article on page 8 for more history)

The CCCD has been water monitoring Donkey Creek within the city limits since 2000. Our most recent projects include a partnership with the City and Campbell County Parks and Rec Department to install the pet waste disposal signs and bags throughout 27 City parks (68 stations) and 7 County parks (24 stations).

In 2018, 60 seedling trees were donated to the Waste Water Treatment Plant to decrease the stormwater runoff.

The Campbell County Conservation District Employee's participated in #trashtag challenge this spring and cleaned up a part of our impaired waters, Donkey Creek!

4th Grade Free Seedling Tree Program

A *Campbell County Parks and Rec Department 1% grant* has sponsored a seedling tree for every 4th grade student in Campbell County in 2019.

A total of 570 Colorado Blue Spruce seedling trees were purchased for distribution to students in 15 schools. Crystal provided presentations and education activities on trees to 672 4th grade students. A total of 540 students were able to take home a tree for planting. The remaining trees were planted at a new shelter belt in partnership with Campbell County Parks and Rec.

Our goal is to educate the youth of Campbell County to ensure the next generation will be wise stewards of America's natural resources. The project also helps youth develop citizenship values and respect for the environment.

Labor Day: What it Means

Labor Day, the first Monday in September, is a creation of the labor movement and is dedicated to the social and economic achievements of American workers. It constitutes a yearly national tribute to the contributions workers have made to the strength, prosperity, and well-being of our country.





Black Hills Natural Resources Youth Camp June 12 - 14, 2019

Area youth gathered once again at Mallo Camp north of Newcastle, WY to participate in the Black Hills Natural Resource Youth Camp June 12-14th. The purpose of this camp is to give youth the opportunity to experience a wide variety of activities and educational sessions teaching them about the natural world and its resources. Other activities included fishing, the Wildman Hike which teaches kids about predators and prey relationships, a talent show, and various games.

Each child participated in six educational sessions they included: “Bears, Bears, Bears”, “Soils”, “Tremendous Trees”, “and Casting for Food”, “Wilderness Scavenger Hunt”, and “Target Practice”.

“Soils” presented by Lacey Sloan with the Weston County Natural Resource District taught campers about different types of soils and soil profiles.

Jessie Halverson, with Project Learning Tree presented “Tremendous Trees” where campers learned about the parts of the tree and what trees need to survive.

In the session “Bears, Bears, Bears” Christina Schmidt; WY Game and Fish; explained to the youth how bears interact with each other, their habitat, how much food they need to survive, and showed the kids different bear hides.

John Marshall and Danny Helwig taught campers all about “Casting for Food”. This activity taught campers how to cast, fish, and properly care for caught fish. Campers were allowed to practice their casting skills and catch fish.

“Wilderness Scavenger Hunt” presented by Jessica Weathers, a Private Lands Biologist, had the kids search nature for items related to animals and their habitats. Items the kids found included a woodpecker hole, bird nest, items animals would eat (seeds, insects, berries), and other animal homes.

Finally, Bob Pollo and Karsen Kellebrew had “Target Practice”. They taught youth how the correct way to shoot a bow and arrow, safety while shooting and let the kids do a little “target practice”.

Sponsors for the Black Hills Natural Resource Youth Camp were the Campbell County Conservation District, the Powder River Conservation District and the Weston County Natural Resource District. We would also like to express our thanks to the Campbell County Community Public Recreation District for the grant they awarded us for camp.



Through Federal and State grants, the Campbell County Conservation District and the Little Powder River Watershed Steering Committee are offering financial assistance for projects that will benefit water quality.




Funding Overview

Typical projects may include installing fencing and stock water to minimize access to waterbodies, relocating corrals or animal feeding areas away from surface water, or replacing septic systems to eliminate sewage discharges. The amount of cost share available for each project varies. Projects ranked as high priority may receive up to 70% funding. If you think you would like to apply for cost-share funds through the District's water quality improvement program, you are highly encouraged to see if you are qualified.

Application Information

Applications will continue to be accepted and reviewed based on fund availability. The District staff is available to answer any questions or provide technical assistance regarding potential projects or the application process. Applications are available at the District office or you can download a copy from our website www.cccdwy.net.



Small Acreage Issue Team Seeding Project

The project is aimed to answer the question of small acreage landowners , “What grasses should I plant that will grow where I live?” The Small Acreage Issue Team goal is to develop an applied study for different parts of the state with the potential to draw parallels for the studies once complete.

CCCD planted 3 separate seed mixes by broadcast in 9 plots in June and plan to broadcast seed in 9 plots in the fall also. The goal is to find out what potentially works and what did not work for the area and be able to provide recommendations for local landowners. Plots are 10’ wide by 20’ long with some weed control and watering planned. The idea is to replicate what small acreage landowners will have for resources, time, weed control options and water. Plots will be photo monitored by CCCD.


Wyoming District and Partners Work to Reduce Fuel Loads

Campbell County Conservation District (CD) is partnering with the Wyoming State Forestry Division and the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) to address two key issues: thinning forests to make stands more resilient to insects and diseases, such as the mountain pine beetle, and reducing fuel loads to restrict wildfire damage and improve wildlife habitat.

“When we collaborate, we’re able to manage these larger landscapes so when a fire comes through – when it gets to the area with less ladder fuel – it will lay down and will be closer to the ground,” Campbell County Conservation District Manager **Jennifer Hinkhouse** said.


In 2015, the conservation district began talking with Wyoming State Forestry Division, Wyoming Game and Fish and the BLM about projects the district was working on to explore partnership opportunities. Campbell County CD received funding through a state appropriation administered by the State Forestry Division to conduct management in beetle infested areas or in areas that had a high potential for infestation.




“Most people forget about the forests in Campbell County since they are about an hour drive from town,” **Hinkhouse said**. “Many of the forests have not received any thinning or harvest in the past 30 years and were in need of management. With the help of state funding and assistance of partners, we were able to put forest conservation on the ground.”

Those funds led to forest stand improvement projects on private land in northern Campbell County. The conservation district worked with a private landowner, the state and BLM to coordinate efforts. The conservation district worked with BLM on areas to receive thinning where BLM had or was going to implement vegetative treatments on their adjacent property. They also coordinated with the state on performing vegetative treatments adjacent to timber sales and thinning projects on adjacent state lands. Once thinning was completed on these projects, the Campbell County CD conducted various slash treatments, which included lop and scatter, chipping and piling. For areas that had been piled, BLM worked with landowners to assist in burning in order to reduce fuel loads on the nearly 200 acres.



Killdeer

Widespread, common, and conspicuous, the Killdeer calls its name as it flies over farmland and other open country. Like other members of the plover family, this species is often found at the water's edge, but it also lives in pastures and fields far from water. At times, it nests on gravel roofs or on lawns. Many a person has been fooled by the bird's "broken-wing" act, in which it flutters along the ground in a show of injury, luring intruders away from its nest.



There are usually 4, sometimes 3-5 eggs. Buff, blotched with black and brown. Incubation is by both parents, 24-28 days. In very hot climates, adults shade eggs in mid-day, and may soak belly feathers to help cool eggs. The downy young leave the nest soon after hatching. Young are tended by both parents, but feed themselves. The age of young at first flight is roughly 25 days. In some warmer parts of range, Killdeers raise 2 broods per year.

DID YOU KNOW?



The Gillette Fishing Lake (GFL) was listed on the 1996 Wyoming's Impaired Waters List as impaired due to high levels of sediment and phosphate.

Beginning in 2008, the CCCD initiated a Storm Drain Sticker Program in partnership with the City of Gillette. Approximately half of the city storm drains collect water in the 27,000 acre area surrounding Gillette and drain into Gillette Fishing Lake (GFL). When it rains, storm water flows over driveways, lawns, and parking lots on its way to the nearest entrance into the storm sewer system. Runoff carries motor oil, gas, pet waste, pesticides, fertilizer, paints and detergents straight into the GFL.

The Summer of 2010, the City added floating islands to GFL as part of an effort to clean up the lake and improve habitat for wildlife. The islands act like a sponge, taking up pollutants through the roots of the plants installed on the island. In 2016, the islands were refurbished and reanchored.

In 2012, the City developed a wetland complex and series of sedimentation ponds at the inlet to the lake to trap sediment before reaching the lake.

To date, 2350 storm drain stickers have been applied by CCCD. Each year, the CCCD applies storm drain stickers to remind people that only water should enter the storm drains. By spreading the word that storm drains are not trash cans, you can keep GFL clean!

Weed & Pest

Update from Campbell County Weed and Pest By Travis Kern, Assistant Supervisor

It was a slow and cold start to the spray season this year, but with temperatures warming up all our crews are in full swing. The amount of precipitation we received this spring and early summer has led to an increase of mosquito habitat in our area. The mosquito crew has had their hands full treating a five-mile radius of mosquito habitat around Gillette. Our small acreage crew is still very active treating White Top, Dalmatian Toadflax, and Knapweeds. Our summer crews continued its fierce fight against Leafy Spurge. As we see most populations decrease, we seem to find new ones that had not been treated previously leading to the increase in acres. If you have any of these species on your property and would like to enroll in this program please contact our office.

As we enter the dog days of summer it is time to start to focus on species that can be treated late summer into fall. Since the introduction of the invasive grass *Ventenata*, our county has begun to see an alarming increase in acreages infested. *Ventenata* is a winter annual grass species that germinates and begins growth in the fall before growing to maturity in the spring and early summer. The species usually grows up to a foot to 18 inches tall. *Ventenata* is smooth and has a shiny appearance. It has a band at the growth node that is dark red to black and has a long membranous ligule where the leaf attaches to the stem. Its inflorescence is an open panicle that has a pyramid shape. The plant's awns on the seed heads are bent and twisted like those of wild oat. This grass usually forms patches that have a distinct color, different from other native range vegetation. *Ventenata* is treated with a pre-emergent herbicide late in the summer before the plant has a chance to germinate. Fall is a good time to treat many of your perennial weed species. After some fall precipitation many of the weed species will have regrowth. This is an excellent time to treat because the plant is taking everything it can down to the root system before going dormant for the Winter. 

Rangeland Renovation Project with US Forest Service

Management of the Thunder Basin National Grassland is complex due to intermingled ownership and jurisdictions. The ability to work with the CCCD to implement a variety of projects across the landscape is invaluable according to the USFS.


Prairie dog management is one issue that involves joint management across land ownership boundaries. A cost effective and coordinated management project to restore and renovate a variety of rangelands and habitats with the objective of achieving healthy and productive natural and agricultural ecosystems is in process in the Spring Creek Unit which is dominated by crested wheat and bulbous bluegrass.

The CCCD will utilize black landscape fabric tarps to solarize 5 plots of unwanted weeds. The tarps were placed in June of 2019, and will be checked the Fall of 2019 for solarization effectiveness. Seeding of the 5 plots will follow in the Fall of 2019 or Spring of 2020 depending on the effectiveness of the fabric. Sagebrush will also be planted in the plot areas the Spring of 2020.

POLLINATOR RESOURCES



Create a pollinator watering station. With sweltering temperatures and more direct sunlight in summer months, sources of water can be hard to find. Add a bowl, dish or even a pie plate to your yard filled with rocks, marbles or pebbles and a shallow layer of fresh water. Spread the substrate evenly to provide pollinators with somewhere to land without drowning. Keep the water station out of direct sunlight and monitor the water levels to make sure there's an adequate supply (and that you don't inadvertently create a mosquito breeding ground!)

Plant a mixture of native flowering plants. If you haven't planted your garden yet, it's not too late! Pick native blooms – a regional pollinator planting guide is available online through Pollinator Partnership, just enter your zip code. Plant a mix of species; biodiversity helps attract a wide range of pollinators and keeps your garden healthy! If you must use pesticides, use them correctly and according to label or avoid their use if possible, as chemicals can affect the health of invertebrates.

Provide natural habitat for native bees. Some of the most easily identifiable pollinators – honeybees – are not native to the U.S. That means they're less effective pollinators than our native, docile North American bees, a majority of which are ground-dwelling. By leaving leaf litter and organic material in your garden bed, you'll provide substrate they can utilize to make nests or use for shelter. Avoid using mulch, or leave some areas of soil uncovered so bees can create or access their tunnels.

Build a bee hotel. Bee hotels or bee boxes provide a hive for solitary bees that do not live in swarms like honeybees do. You can use scrap lumber (ideally older, weathered scraps that have less chemical treatment) to build a frame in any size or shape suitable for your yard. The frame must be at least six inches in depth and enclosed at the back. Slope the roof to avoid rainfall pooling and add bamboo, reeds, tubes or blocks of wood with drilled holes to create the hotel 'rooms'. Stack the rooms, and mount the hotel at chest height facing south.


