

Grant extension offers additional assistance to unemployed coal industry workers

CHEYENNE, Wyo. - Governor Mark Gordon announced Tuesday that workers impacted by coal industry layoffs will have renewed access to \$1.7 million in grant funding.

The funding has been made available through a grant extension applied for by the Wyoming Department of Workforce Services (DWS) through the U.S. Department of Labor. It will expand the ability of DWS to assist displaced coal industry workers through workplace planning, training and supportive services.

“This grant funding comes at a critical time for our state,” Governor Gordon said. “As we adjust to changes in the economy, it’s important for our workforce to have opportunities and resources that can help them remain in Wyoming. I want to thank DWS Director Robin Sessions Cooley and her staff for diligently pursuing this funding, as well as the Department of Labor for the expedited extension.”

Cooley said that while she is encouraged by ongoing negotiations that would make the currently closed mines in Campbell County fully operational, she also remains committed to assisting impacted workers and the community at large. “This award is an important investment option for Wyoming communities,” Director Cooley said. “DWS is doing all it can to support Wyoming coal workers. This funding is another tool available to them.”

Coal industry workers who have lost their jobs due to layoffs are eligible for tuition assistance to train for new careers and other services through the POWER Grant (Partnerships for Opportunity and Workforce Economic Revitalization). The POWER Grant was first awarded to Wyoming in 2017, shortly after coal industry layoffs in 2016. The grant’s intent is to support economic diversification for communities negatively

impacted by downturns in the coal economy. The funding supports workforce development activities that prepare dislocated workers for jobs in high-demand occupations aligned with regional economic strategies.

The original grant was slated to end on Sept. 30, 2019, but the recent extension means the funding will be available through June of 2021.

State board to consider two community grants Oct. 3

The State Loan and Investment Board (SLIB) will consider two Business Ready Community (BRC) grant requests during its Oct. 3 quarterly meeting at 8 a.m. in the WYDOT Auditorium, [5300 Bishop Blvd.](#), in Cheyenne.

BUSINESS READY COMMUNITY (BRC) GRANT APPLICATIONS

Business Council staff review each application, conduct site visits, or conference calls in the case of planning grants, and make presentations to a board subcommittee before making final recommendations to the full board.

About the Program: The Wyoming Business Council administers the Business Ready Community grant and loan program, which provides financing for publicly owned infrastructure that serves the needs of businesses and promotes economic development within Wyoming communities.

The Business Council board is required by statute to forward BRC grant and loan recommendations to the State Loan and Investment Board (SLIB) for final approval. The SLIB is comprised of the five statewide elected officials: the governor, secretary of state, state auditor, state treasurer and state superintendent of public instruction.

The SLIB will make final decisions on BRC projects on Oct. 3.

Community Development - Readiness

- **Town of Alpine** requests a \$2,300,370 grant for a modular wastewater pretreatment system and sludge handling facility at the town's wastewater treatment plant. The pretreatment system will have the ability to accommodate the current and future organic waste from the Melvin Brewery as well as future commercial and industrial developments. (*Business Council board recommends funding as requested.*)

Community Development - Enhancement

- **City of Casper** requests a \$500,000 grant phase III to restore 13.5 miles of the North Platte River and its banks that traverse Casper. Funds will be used to enhance channel form and function; improve fish and wildlife habitat; stabilize eroding banks; improve passive treatment of storm water; and improve aesthetics along a 2,700-foot segment immediately downstream of the former BP-Amoco Refinery. Funds will also be used to purchase a portion of property and construct a boat dock at the river's intersection with West B Street. (*Business Council board does not recommend funding.*)

Continuing education credits will be offered to law enforcement, attorneys, and other professionals for participation in the Day of Prevention. Watch for more information prior to the event.


