





The animal shelter will be moving to our temporary facility sometime in the next week. The temporary facility is located right across the parking lot from the current shelter so you won't have any trouble finding us.

The animal shelter will be moving to our temporary facility sometime in the next week. The temporary facility is located right across the parking lot from the current shelter so you won't have any trouble finding us. Please be patient and understand that we will do the best we can to help you but will be limited on the services we can offer during this transition.

There will be a couple of changes that we want to let everyone know about:

1. Due to extremely limited space, we will no longer accept unwanted pet surrenders without an appointment. If you call or stop in with an unwanted pet, we will allow you to put up a poster, put the pet on our Petfinder.Com page, do background checks or home checks for rehoming within the City of Gillette, and put you on a waiting list so if a cage or kennel opens up, we will call you.
2. Our pet area and lobby public access will be limited. Check out Petfinder.Com before coming to the shelter so you know if there is a dog or cat you are interested in. We will have limited room for people to walk through so if you aren't missing a pet or have one in mind for adoption, you may be asked to come back after we move back into the regular shelter.
3. If you are missing a pet, you are responsible to come to the shelter and look for your pet. With such limited space and so many animals, you must come yourself or have someone who will recognize your pet come to the shelter to check, daily if necessary.
4. Stray animals will be accepted as usual. Holding periods are between 3-5 days, so if a pet isn't claimed during that time, it will be adopted or euthanized. Come look for missing animals the day they go missing and each day after that. We are not a boarding facility and will not board pets, so please come claim missing animals immediately.

Wyoming Business Council board begins nationwide search for new CEO

The Wyoming Business Council board of directors has [begun its search](#) for a new Chief Executive Officer. The board hopes to have the new CEO in place by the first of the new year. In September, current CEO Shawn Reese, announced his resignation, effective the end of this year.

The Business Council's mission is [to create new opportunities for current and future generations of Wyomingites](#) by adding value to Wyoming's core industries and leveraging them to activate new economic sectors. The Business Council serves businesses, entrepreneurs and startups, industry and communities for the benefit of current and future generations of Wyomingites.

The CEO will lead the Business Council to realize diverse, broad and lasting economic growth for Wyoming by creating and nurturing an organization inspired to reach its greatest potential. The CEO will report to a governor-appointed board of directors and will work with staff, a team of leaders, partner organizations and elected officials to establish goals, plans and strategies that support statewide economic diversification.

The CEO search committee includes Gov. Mark Gordon, Business Council directors and staff, as well as representatives from the Legislature, ENDOW Executive Council, Wyoming Economic Development Association, the University of Wyoming and various industry and community stakeholders.

The committee will close the job posting Nov. 5. Interviews are scheduled to be held on Nov. 12 and 21, with finalists notified by Nov. 25. The final public, in-person interviews will be held Dec. 6 in Cheyenne. This timeline is subject to change.

"We look forward to this challenge and feel confident we will find the right person who will bring strong leadership and fresh energy to this position and the organization," said the Co-Chair of the Business Council's board of directors, Megan Goetz. "The next CEO will have an enormous impact on Wyoming's future, and will ensure the mission and efforts of economic diversification and development for the state continue forward."

Storm Event Overview:

On 10/09/2019 the weather forecast was predicting a winter storm with the potential of large snow accumulations. **A level one snow emergency was declared to begin at noon that day.**

At 5:04 p.m. the Streets on call person was called in to address slick bridges caused by freezing drizzle and snow. By 6:30 p.m. other street areas began freezing so the night crew was called in and the snow event began.

The night crew applied material and began plowing priority streets and trouble areas as snowfall increased. Snowfall continued on and off through the night, keeping the night crew focused on plowing the priority streets and trouble areas.

At 2:00 a.m. Parks employees came in to assist by plowing and applying material to subdivision streets.

At 7:00 a.m. the Streets Division conducted shift change and the day crew continued working priority, trouble and subdivision streets. By 10:00 a.m. the snowfall had decreased and the Parks employees were able to end their shift. Streets day crew finished up the remaining subdivision streets and monitored trouble areas for icy spots.

By mid afternoon the streets were clear and drying out in spite of the snow squalls that blew through on and off. The weather continued to improve and the snow event was ended at 3:00 p.m. on 10/10/2019.
