RE: Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) Improvements Project
Financing Options Review and Recommendation

Based on a Condition Assessment of the City's WWTP completed by HDR Engineering, Inc. in 2019, the City of Gillette has identified several "high priority" projects to replace failing equipment and other equipment that lacks redundancy. The total cost of these high priority projects is \$20M. During their Work Session on December 10, 2019, the City Council directed staff to review bonding and loans to finance the proposed improvements.

City Staff met with lending experts in January to review four different financing options for this project.

1. Conventional Municipal Bonding represented by a Bond Attorney and Bond Broker where bonds for the project are sold in large blocks to investment banks.
2. Non-Traditional Bonding represented by a Financial Advisor and broker where bonds are recorded and sold through block-chain technology to a combination of investment banks and/or local investors.
3. Federal Clean Water Revolving Loan administered by the State of Wyoming through DEQ and SLIB.
4. State Capital Construction Loan administered by the State of Wyoming through SLIB.

Each of the aforementioned financial options assume the following:

- a. The City desires to "borrow" or "bond" \$20M for the entire project.
- b. The City will begin drawdowns in FY 20/21, which starts July 1, 2020.
- c. All aspects of the project will be complete and operational by June 30, 2025
- d. The City would like to secure a \$20M Loan @ 2.5% interest (or less) for a 20 year term.


Based on our conversations with a variety of lending experts, City Staff recommends we pursue a State of Wyoming Capital Construction Loan through the Permanent Mineral Trust Fund (PMTF) for the following reasons:

1. Funding is readily available from \$200 million previously set aside by the Wyoming State Legislature from the PMTF for large capital construction projects for Cities, Towns and Counties.
2. If we submit an application in March, the \$20M Loan proceeds should be available for construction to commence after July 1, 2020.

3. For the State Loan, there is no need to contract with a Financial Advisor or Bond Counsel.
4. Unlike bonding, a general election or ordinance is not necessary.
5. The first principal & interest payment for the loan is not due until one year following substantial completion of the project. This provides several years for the City to gradually raise wastewater rates to meet the future repayment schedule. By comparison, bonding requires repayment no later than one year following the first drawdown from the bond proceeds. This will result in a sudden, drastic increase in our wastewater rates to make the first payment.
6. The PMTF Loan does not have any Federal requirements like “Buy America”, prevailing wages for labor, disadvantaged business preference, etc. Likewise the PMTF Loan does not have any NEPA (environmental) permitting and public comment requirements, other than a DEQ permit required by the State. The Federal Clean Water Loan has all of these requirements, which will significantly increase the cost and significantly increase the completion time for the project.
7. The interest rate for the PMTF Loan is slightly less than the Federal Clean Water Loan. (2.125% vs 2.5% for \$20 million for a 20 year term)

In summary, City Staff has reviewed a variety of bonding and loan finance options for the \$20M WWTP Improvements Project. Based on our review, City Staff recommends we submit an application to the State of Wyoming Loan and Investment Board for a \$20 million PMTF loan for a 20 year term through their Capital Construction Loan program.







From the CEO



I hope that the new year finds you well. Looking back, 2019 was full of challenges and opportunities for Energy Capital Economic Development. Among the efforts to grow and diversify the economy in Campbell County, what stands out most among our successes is the progress on two of our major projects: ACPIC and FUEL Business Incubator.

The FUEL Business Incubator saw growth and expansion bringing new startup businesses to our community. Several of those businesses were profiled in last year's newsletters. Our goal is to attract another 6-8 tenants with new or emerging businesses.

The Advanced Carbon Products Innovation Center (ACPIC) also made major strides forward. Our \$1.46 million grant from Economic Development Administration (EDA) to help fund the facility was approved in August 2019. In November, we purchased the land and are now in the process of selecting an Architectural / Engineering firm to design the facility. We expect to have the design complete later this year and the construction complete in 2021.

We are excited to be building the ACPIC as it will be one of the foundational components of Carbon Valley with research and review of potential commercial application for advanced carbon products. There's a lot of public interest in efforts to find new uses for carbon-based products, and ACPIC will provide a home for companies finding ways to capitalize. We anticipate the ACPIC will

bring multiple projects, grants and opportunities to develop new uses for coal. Our community has many organizations that rely on Powder River Basic coal, and we hope to preserve a market for our coal, grow and diversify our economy with new manufactures and ensure a strong economic future for our community.

The legislative session kicks off this month on February 10. We will be hosting a reception in Cheyenne on February 12 for our local business and community leaders. We expect many legislators, elected officials and state staff to attend. This is our fourth reception in Cheyenne to help promote Campbell County businesses. We have had very good attendance by local businesses and by legislators. Each year, the Governor has stopped in and has had the opportunity to connect with Campbell County business leaders. This is an excellent event and a good opportunity to meet legislators from around the state. Our sponsors are Energy Capital Economic Development, Black Hills Energy, Campbell County Chamber of Commerce, the City of Gillette and Campbell County. 





Snow Event Report #18

Event Start Date: 1/29/2020 Event Start Time: 4:30 a.m.

Storm Event Overview:

On 1/29/2020 at 4:30 a.m. the Streets on-call person called in the night crew due to falling snow and slick roads. The crew began plowing and applying material to priority streets and trouble areas. At 7:00 a.m. the day crew joined in the efforts with any available equipment. By 10:30 a.m. the temperature had risen to 37 degrees and the streets were melting off.

Since the forecast was predicting more snow and conditions seemed uncertain the snow event was left open even though plowing operations were suspended.

Snow began again during the early morning hours of 1/30/2020. Streets day crew resumed operations and initially had to deal with developing slick areas as snow showers moved through the area. As the day progressed, bursts of heavy snow moved through town keeping the day crew busy on priority streets and trouble areas. The streets quickly became snow packed and slick in all areas of the city. Gusting winds picked up and caused near white out conditions in some parts of Gillette. Plow drivers were challenged with low visibility, traffic and slick road surfaces.

The storm ended quickly, mid-afternoon and the temperature warmed enough to begin melting some areas. Around 5:00 p.m. the temperature dropped as the sun began to set, wet areas froze rapidly. The day crew worked to address the changing road conditions on priority streets.

At 7:00 p.m. Night crew took over and were eventually able to shift their focus to trouble areas and subdivision streets. Winds had calmed down and the temperature was holding in the mid-20s. Night crew finished the subdivisions and trouble spots by 3:00 a.m. The crew shut down for the night.

At 5:00 a.m. the on-call person was called out for icy areas on Skyline Drive, Echeta Rd and several other spots. Two trucks went out and took care of these areas as well as spot checking several other common problem spots.

With clear skies and plowing operations finished, the event was ended at 7:30 a.m. on 1/31/2020.
