- Pursuant to W.S. 6-10-106, a person convicted of a felony is incompetent to hold any office of honor, unless they have had a complete and full restoration of rights, not just voting rights.
- Applicants should ensure that they are not holding an office which may conflict, or be incompatible, with the office for which they are filing; and, their employment is compatible with the office they are seeking.

If you are interested in applying, pick up an application in the City Clerk's office at City Hall, located at 201 E. 5th Street. You may also download from the City website. Applications will be made available on September 9th. All applications must be submitted in person to the City Clerk's office at City Hall.

### **Brooks Avenue**

### US Department of Energy and State of Wyoming Partner on Study Showing Potential of Carbon Capture at Wyoming Coal-Fired Power Plants

CHEYENNE, Wyo. – The U.S. Department of Energy has completed a carbon capture, utilization and storage (CCUS) study for several Wyoming coal-fueled power plants. The study showed CCUS retrofits can provide significant benefits. The goal of the study was to evaluate the potential opportunities for retrofitting existing power plants with CCUS technology, the economic impact, and the carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>) emissions reductions for the State of Wyoming compared to alternatives. Governor Mark Gordon requested the study.

“We are in a critical time for energy policy and production. Wyoming can help lead in developing and supporting advances that boost our coal industry and reduce carbon emissions. The Department of Energy is also providing key leadership: this study is an example of

a partnership everyone can support. It moves Wyoming and the nation ahead,” Governor Gordon said.

“The Department of Energy has invested hundreds of millions of taxpayers’ dollars to advance CCUS technologies and to drive down the cost of deployment,” said Deputy Secretary of Energy Mark Menezes. “This study shows that through innovative technologies, like CCUS, we can develop affordable energy more cleanly, and clean energy more affordably, providing a vision for the future of fossil energy. Electricity generated from fossil fuels that is reliable, cost effective and nearly zero CO2 emissions is in the best interest of Wyoming and the country. I applaud Governor Gordon’s vision and value Wyoming’s leadership in CCUS.”

DOE’s partnership with the State of Wyoming was led by Assistant Secretary of Fossil Energy Steve Winberg.

“Given recent events in California, this timely report demonstrates the need for clean, reliable fossil fuel baseload generation. Aggressive CCUS initiatives could establish Wyoming as a world leader in that technology. That effort would pay large and increasing dividends to the state as CCUS becomes one of the dominant economic and energy technologies of the 21st century. Governor Gordon’s leadership is providing a model for others to follow,” Winberg said.

The study compared CCUS use to an alternative case in the most recent PacifiCorp 2019 integrated resource plan (IRP). The results showed CCUS retrofits provided the following potential benefits:

- Reduced CO2 emissions by 37% (100 million metric tons) more than the 2019 IRP preferred portfolio (henceforth referred to as Baseline IRP),
- Produced avoided costs for CO 2 emissions that are \$24 per ton (\$21.5/metric ton) less expensive than the Baseline IRP,
- Reduced the amount ratepayers could pay by approximately 10% less per month than the Baseline IRP,
- Lifted Wyoming employment benefits up to 5 times higher than employment benefits from implementing the Baseline IRP,
- Produced higher local and state revenue from property, sale, severance, and other associated coal taxes as well as higher federal royalty payments.

The study team was led by Leonardo Technologies Inc., with financial and technical support from the US Department of Energy, Office of Fossil Energy with technical contributions from the National Energy Technology Laboratory, Management Information Services Inc., the University of Wyoming School of Energy Resources’ (SER) Center for Economic Geology Research, and the Enhanced Oil Recovery Institute. The study considered the retrofit of nine units at four power plants in Wyoming owned by Rocky Mountain Power.

“I thank Secretary Brouillette, his team and the many other contributors to the Wyoming CCUS study. This thorough work provides a valuable analysis of the potential of CO2 capture and use in Wyoming. It complements the passage of HB 200 by the Wyoming Legislature. That legislation provides incentives for companies to invest in Wyoming coal and coal-fired units as a continued source of energy, while reducing CO2 emissions. Wyoming stands ready to embrace those challenges and continue to provide energy to the US,” Governor Gordon said.

## Future Wyoming ITC Tenant Awarded \$16 Million in Funding

*Gas Technology Institute Awarded \$13M from DOE, \$3.25M in Additional Funds*

**Cheyenne, Wyoming** – A leading research and development organization has been awarded to receive funding from the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) to test carbon capture technologies at the Wyoming Integrated Test Center (ITC). The \$16 million project is a part of DOE's Carbon Capture, Utilization, and Storage R&D investment program.

“Public and private funding for research and development is absolutely critical to advancing carbon capture technologies,” said Jason Begger, Managing Director at Wyoming ITC. “We will be excited to welcome Gas Technology Institute to the ITC as a part of Wyoming’s commitment to advancing carbon capture technologies.”

Gas Technology Institute (GTI) received a total of \$13 million in funding from the DOE investment program as well as an additional \$3.25 million in non-federal funding. GTI will utilize these funds to design and build an engineering-scale CO<sub>2</sub> capture system using the

Ohio State University transformational membrane process. GTI will also conduct tests on coal flue gas at the Wyoming ITC to demonstrate a continuous, steady-state operation for a minimum of two months and gather data for further process scale-up. The project will attempt to achieve the DOE's transformational carbon capture performance goal of CO<sub>2</sub> capture with 95 percent CO<sub>2</sub> purity at a cost of \$30 per ton.

DOE recently announced the award of approximately \$72 million in federal funding to support the development and advancement of carbon capture technologies. Under this cost-shared research and development (R&D), DOE is awarding funding to nine new projects for coal and natural gas power and industrial sources. Through DOE's Carbon Capture, Utilization, and Storage R&D Program, the Office of Fossil Energy has a comprehensive portfolio of technological solutions that help keep CO<sub>2</sub> emissions out of the atmosphere. Many of these R&D efforts can be applied across both the energy and the industrial sectors.

GTI is a leading independent non-profit research, development, and training organization that works to address global energy and environmental challenges. These challenges include expanding supplies of affordable and clean energy, delivering solutions for efficient and environmentally responsible use of energy, and reducing and managing carbon emissions.

# Wyoming Economic Indicators

▶ Figure 1: Wyoming Economic Health Index as of June 2020




▶ SUMMARY: The Wyoming Economic Health Index (WEHI) reported an index value of 97.3 in June 2020 (see Figure 1). This value was higher than the May 2020 value of 95.5, but significantly lower than the June 2019 value of 108. The WEHI saw slight increases in both May and June after a huge drop in April, reflecting the slow recovery from the Covid-19 recession.


▶ NOTE: The Wyoming Economic Health Index combines four state-level economic indicators into one number in order to sum up the current economic conditions in Wyoming. The four economic indicators are (1) the monthly unemployment rate, (2) monthly total non-farm employment, (3) monthly sales and use tax collections from the mining sector, and (4) monthly sales and use tax collections from lodging. All data used in the WEHI are seasonally adjusted. Additionally, both tax collection indicators are inflation adjusted.


▶ Figure 2: Change in WEHI - Last 6 Months

▶ Figure 4: Wyoming and United States Unemployment Rate




▶ For each of the last six months (January 2020 - June 2020), the WEHI reported year-over-year decreases, with the largest decline occurring in May at -11.1% compared to May 2019 (see Figure 2).

All four components of the WEHI were worse in June 2020 compared to June last year (see Figure 3). Sales and use tax collections for the state reported large year-over-year declines in June, with collections from the mining and lodging sectors falling by 66.5% and 46.2% respectively.


The unemployment rate for Wyoming in June was 7.6%, lower than May 2020 (8.8%) and April 2020 (9.6%), but higher than the June 2019 unemployment rate of 3.6% (see Figure 4). These improved unemployment rates over the last couple of months are a bright sign that the recovery from the Covid-19 business shutdowns has begun.

▶▶ The total number of nonfarm payroll jobs in June 2020 was 266,300, higher than the May 2020 number by 2,500, but lower than the June 2019 number by 24,100 (see Figure 5). Although total employment over the past few months is the lowest it has been since 2005, it has increased for two consecutive months.


▶ Figure 6. Wyoming 4% Sales and Use Tax Collections - Mining Sector (1-month lag)



▶▶ Wyoming's collection of the 4% sales and use tax from the mining sector was \$3.8 million in June 2020, \$0.5 million less than May 2020 and \$7.5 million less than June last year (see Figure 6). After six months of calendar year 2020 (January-June), total collections from the mining sector summed to \$39.6 million, \$11.7 million less (-22.9%) than the 5-year average sum over the same six months.

Note: July collections mostly reflect sales that occurred in June. Therefore, there is a 1-month lag implemented in order to accurately track sales activity in a given month.

▶▶ Wyoming's collection of the 4% sales and use tax from lodging was \$1.7 million in June 2020, 46% less than June last year (see Figure 7). This is the fourth consecutive month of year-over-year declines over 35%. These large decreases in collections from lodging are not surprising because of the stay at home orders and lack of travel due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

Note: July collections mostly reflect sales that occurred in June. Therefore, there is a 1-month lag implemented in order to accurately track sales activity in a given month.

## Wyoming Economic Health Index Addendum

The Wyoming Economic Health Index (WEHI) is a coincident economic indicator that is designed to provide a current assessment of the state's economy. There are four components of the WEHI. The first two components, unemployment rate and total nonfarm employment, are included to capture overall labor market activity for Wyoming. The third component, sales and use tax collections related to the mining sector, captures economic activity related to mineral production in the state. The fourth component, sales and use tax collections related to lodging, serves as a proxy for tourism activity in the state.

**Unemployment Rate:** The first component of the WEHI is the unemployment rate. This statistic measures the percentage of people in Wyoming who are actively looking for work, but do not have jobs. In the WEHI model, the employment rate (100% minus the unemployment rate) is indexed rather than the unemployment rate because an increase in the employment rate, similar to an increase in total employment, mining activity, and tourism activity, is considered to be a positive for the state's economy. The unemployment rate is available monthly, seasonally adjusted, from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

**Total Nonfarm Employment:** The second component of the WEHI is total nonfarm employment. This statistic measures the number of people who have wage or salary jobs in Wyoming. The total nonfarm employment is available monthly, seasonally adjusted, from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics.

**Mining Sales & Use Tax:** The third component of the WEHI is sales and use tax collections related to the mining sector (including oil and gas extraction). Because sales and use tax collections received by the state for a given month represent transactions that took place 4 to 6 weeks prior, the data is lagged one month in the WEHI model. This statistic is available monthly from the State of Wyoming's Department of Revenue. The data is adjusted for inflation using the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The data is also seasonally adjusted.

**Lodging Sales & Use Tax:** The fourth component of the WEHI is sales and use tax collections from lodging. Again, because sales and use tax collections received by the state for a given month of transactions represent transactions that took place 4 to 6 weeks prior, the data is lagged one month in the WEHI model. This statistic is available monthly from the State of Wyoming's Department of Revenue. The data is adjusted for inflation using the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. The data is also seasonally adjusted.

**Methodology:** Each series for the components discussed above are standardized starting in January 2005, resulting in a value of 100 for each component and the WEHI. As each component changes from month to month, the WEHI value changes. Next, the standard deviation of each component's standardized series values is calculated, followed by the calculation of the inverse of each component's standard deviation. Lastly, the individual inverse standard deviations are standardized, resulting in weights that sum to 1. The rationale for this weighting approach is that the components that are more stable over time will have a smaller standard deviation and thus, a larger inverse standard deviation and weight. A large shift in a typically stable data series would provide a better signal of a change in the economy than a large shift in a data series that typically has large fluctuations. Therefore, this weighting approach allows the WEHI to put a larger weight on the more stable components so that if they do experience a large shift, the WEHI's value will be affected more to represent the change in the state's economic conditions.

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

### **Lost Wages Assistance**

DWS is currently working diligently to program the Unemployment Insurance (UI) system in order to administer the Lost Wages Assistance payments to our UI claimants. LWA benefits in the amount of \$300 per week are available to UI claimants who are unemployed as a direct result of COVID-19 and who are receiving at least \$100 per week in UI benefits.

The LWA program includes a finite amount of funding. The State of Wyoming was required to apply for funding from FEMA, and we have received approval for at least three weeks of funding for our eligible UI claimants, and those payments will be backdated to the week ending Aug. 1. Payments beyond the first three weeks of the program must be applied for on a weekly basis.

We will keep you updated on the status of the LWA program through these weekly newsletters.
