

As usual, dinner and planning discussions will begin at 6:00 p.m. Minutes from your April meeting are also enclosed and bills needing your review and approval will be sent to you by email Monday, May 11. Please let me know if you are unable to attend.

I have enclosed introduction letters for three new CAM-PLEX team members. This is a way for you to know about them on a personal level. Ben, Will, and Mark have all been invited to eat dinner with us. Will is unable to attend due to a family event. Please introduce yourself and help them feel welcome as part of our team. In addition to this letter, I have asked them each to take a few minutes to introduce themselves as part of our meeting. Their contact information has been updated on our contacts list if you need to communicate with them. **(Enclosure #1, #2, & #3)**

We have an excellent line-up of events at CAM-PLEX for the upcoming month. These will be discussed during our staff reports. Greg, Jaymi, and ReNae will each take some time to discuss their areas of responsibility. Please review the enclosed theater information and plan on attending CAM-PLEX events when your schedule permits.

We will revisit the Horse Shelter Installation bid proposals for your consideration and approval. The low bid from Mr. Don Ramsour was approved at our April meeting contingent upon him receiving the proper license from the City of Gillette. He was unable to acquire this license in the time allotted and withdrew his bid. I have communicated with Mr. Gary Gilbert who was the next lowest bid about this and he wants the work and his bid will stand. The bid tabulation sheet is included in your packet for reference purposes. We will discuss how we will fund this project since it is over budget significantly. **(Enclosure #4) Motion to approve the low bid for the Horse Shelter Installation project.**

We conducted the bid opening for the Barn 3 Roof project with Dale Buckingham on Wednesday, May 6. Board Chairmen L.D. Gilbert was present. The bid tabulation sheet is included in your packet. **(Enclosure #5)** We received the other bid from GEM City Roofing late and it was not considered. **Motion to approve the low bid for the Barn 3 Roof project.**

We are proposing minor changes to our concessions agreements to make them consistent and easier to understand for our staff and our vendors. I have included this proposal in your packet. **(Enclosure #6)** I

consulted with Frank Stevens and his recommendation is to discuss it as a Board. **Motion to approve changes to Concessions Agreement Changes as outlined.**

I have sent out several emails asking for availability for our Bill Charney Board Training. I heard from the majority of you, and so I have set the date of August 28 & 29 for this training to occur. We will discuss any conflicts and I will proceed with the planning unless given other direction by you as a Board.

We have conflicts with several upcoming Board meetings. In July our Board meeting conflicts with the National High School Finals Rodeo check in. We have scheduled CAM-PLEX staff to be in Rock Springs during that time including myself and Greg Rook. Our August meeting is during PGI and on the same night as the Gary Allan concert. We will discuss solutions to these problems and decide how we would like to proceed.

In my General Managers Report I will update you about the PGI site visit, give you a brief update on budget discussions with the City and the County and talk about our progress with the Lease Agreement discussion from prior Board meetings.

2. **APPROVAL OF AGENDA: Mr. Evenson made a motion to approve the April 9, 2015 agenda as amended.** Mr. Lundvall seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

3. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Mr. Hamm made a motion to approve the March 12, 2015 meeting minutes.** Mrs. Silvernell seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

4. **APPROVAL OF WARRANTS: Mr. Ostlund made a motion to approve the warrants as presented.** Mr. Lundvall seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

- March 2015 Accounts Payable Voucher Numbers 44007-44095 (General Fund/Special Events) in the amount of \$271,848.67.
- March 2015 Manual Purchase Order Numbers 8662-8792 in the amount of \$96,431.51.

5. **CITIZENS' COMMENTS:** None

6. **VIDEO REPORT:** March events were shown.

7. **STAFF REPORTS:**

- Greg Rook, Operations Manager, reported the Barn 3 Roof Bid should be available for Board approval at the May meeting. Wrangler Road Project pre-construction meeting is next Monday and project will start soon.
- Jaymi Gilmour-Crowley, Theater Manager, informed the Board Menopause the Musical has had great sales and may sell out. Alpin Hong with Crushed out will perform on May 23. The PGI concert was announced this week with country artist Gary Allan performing in the Wyoming Center on Thursday, August 13 and Jalan Crossland opening for him. Tickets go on sale this Monday. Missoula Children's Theatre auditions are next Tuesday with the performance on Saturday. Next week the PAW and Rock Band applications are available.

- ReNae Keuck, Comptroller, met with and discussed concerns and questions with City and County staff regarding the 2015-2016 Budget. The changes she distributed at the last Board meeting is what the Board will approve tonight. Any other changes such as the County approved raises will be inserted into the budget. A final copy will be given to the Board members. This approved final budget will be submitted next Wednesday to the funding agencies for their approval.
- Barbara Stugart, Interim Marketing Manager, stated 250 campers have signed up for PGI camping. Twenty of them have been paired with locally rented campers. She also has been working on the PGI advertising budget. The Marketing Department has been occupied on obtaining a couple of new events. One is the Retriever National Specialty which is a huge dog show for next year along with a Request for Proposal for the Wyoming Senior Olympics. Finally, The Rally, a large RV event is looking for dates in 2017. Family RV & Campers and the Christian Motorcycle Association rally setups are being worked on. The Marketing Department's branding campaign of wrapping panels used in the barns with durable vinyl CAM-PLEX logos and on the barn beams is going well.

8. BUSINESS ITEMS:

- A. Approval of 2015-2016 Budget –**Mrs. Silvernell made a motion to approve the 2015/2016 Campbell County Public Land Board Budget as presented with amendments provided by ReNae at last meeting.** Mr. Ostlund seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.
- B. Discuss Horse Shelter Installation Bids – Dialogue about the vast price range difference was discussed. The low bidder was contacted and CAM-PLEX staff went line by line of the bid document proposal with the contractor to make sure each requirement was understood and met. CAM-PLEX staff and contractor are confident with the bid. Contractor is an established contractor from the Casper area. There is a built in one-year Craftsman Warranty in the signed Invitation to Bid document. Paul will inform the Board when the City License comes in. **Mr. Lundvall moved to approve the low bid for the Horse Shelter Installation project from NWP, LLC, for the amount of \$81,948.00 upon subject of obtaining an approved City Contractor's License.** Mr. Hamm seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.
- C. MOU for Spirit Hall Ice Arena – Paul and legal counsel, Mr. Frank Stevens, met and made MOU revisions. The Board discussed who should be responsible for the potential high maintenance costs of Spirit Hall - Campbell County Park & Recreation Department (CCPRD) and/or CAM-PLEX. CCPRD does not rent this facility and incurs their costs mostly during the ice season. The Board discussed possibly splitting the cost of capital items that deal directly with the ice or CCPRD being solely responsible. CCPRD needs to get funding approval from only the County where CAM-PLEX requires approval from both funding entities. CCPRD has the experts on ice but as owners of the facility the Board and CAM-PLEX staff need to maintain control; however, but the Board would like to see CCPRD obtain the funds for major repairs. CAM-PLEX has not done any ice events to date and Mr. Stevens clarified in the MOU who would be responsible for event costs, notifications, and revenue gained related to ice events. Plumbing, lighting, sound is CAM-PLEX's responsibility. Consensus from the Board was CCPRD should also assist in snow removal and Mr. Stevens will make that change on the MOU. The ice skating season in Spirit Hall states the season begins in August and the Board agrees this should be approved on a year-by-year basis. Mr. Stevens will further work with Mr. Dave McCormick from CCPRD and Paul to clarify the document and will get back to the Board.

- D. **Madison Water/Bike Path Easement** – Greg recommended approving a possible requested easement from the City for a grant funded bike path. Earlier the Board approved an easement for the Madison Water Pipeline mixing line connection. The line will be bored underneath the railroad tracks and Highway 51 to the right-of-way on the south side of the road. Preliminary discussion from the City is they would like the Board to possibly approve an easement for the Madison Water Pipeline on CAM-PLEX property so that the bike path which is scheduled first could be built parallel to the road. When the mixing line is ready to be connected to the Madison Water Pipeline, they would like to put it on CAM-PLEX property so they do not have to tear up the bike path. The Board asked Greg to find out if there is was a grant deadline to build the bike path and if an extension could be given or if the mixer line could be bored now and later connected to the Madison Pipeline so the bike path could be built.

9. **GENERAL MANAGER’S REPORT:**

- A. **PGI Update** – Paul thanked the Board for attending all the recent planning meetings. He informed the Board of the PGI site visit is next week on Friday and Saturday. PGI and local counterparts will pair up and discuss concerns and needs particular to their fields. On Tuesday August 11 PGI’s display night will be in honor of Wyoming’s 125<sup>th</sup> Statehood Anniversary. Diane Shober from Wyoming Tourism is working on getting the Governor and other dignitaries to attend this event. Hotel and camping is going well for PGI members and donations from community have been great.
- B. **Wi-Fi Project Update** – Project is being done all over CAM-PLEX grounds. They are on schedule for their May 1<sup>st</sup> deadline. Paul will get a fiber update from the City.
- C. **Fair Board Contract Update** – Paul met with Bobbi Jo from the Fair Office and the contract has been reworded and more defined. One of the items defined was the fulltime overtime issue. Chairman Gilbertz will sign contracts after tonight’s meeting.

Bill Charney was in town today and gave Paul some dates for Board training. The training will be a two day seminar. Paul will e-mail the available dates to the Board members. General consensus was Board training at the end of the week after the fiscal year beginning in July.

10. **BOARD COUNSEL REPORT:** Nothing to report.

11. **BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS:** Board members would like a future discussion on the agenda regarding improving Board minutes being taken and recorded along with staff & video reports from the managers.

12. **ADJOURNMENT:** Mr. Lundvall made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Mr. Hamm seconded and it passed unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 7:24 p.m.


Ben has been married to Heather for 3 years and has 3 boys ages 21, 23, & 25. He enjoys fishing, boating and most of all spending time with his family.

## Concessions Agreement Proposed Changes

**20% or 25%:** We have had contracts that have a 20% or a 25% take on concessions depending upon the event. This was confusing for our staff and our vendors and hard to be consistent in determining.

*Our proposal is that we change to a 20% take regardless of the event type.*

**Cleaning of Vicinity:** The following paragraph was in the 25% take concession contracts but not 20% or room rental contracts. We propose that we add the following paragraph to our new concessions contract.

*Concessionaire is responsible for keeping the immediate vicinity of concession area clean. This includes the busing of tables and trash control. CAM-PLEX will provide adequate trash receptacles. CAM-PLEX will provide basic utilities available on site for the operation of concession areas.*

**Appropriate Attire:** The old contract wording on the large event concession contracts is lengthy and unnecessary. Here is the old wording.

The type of image portrayed, regarding the delivery of services at CAM-PLEX facilities, is a very critical component of the total CAM-PLEX operation. People working on CAM-PLEX grounds are often perceived to be CAM-PLEX employees. Visitors expect first rate service which is presented in a professional manner. All employees working in a CAM-PLEX concession area must abide by the following dress and appearance code:

1. All shirts worn by concession staff must have a sleeve that is no less than four inches from the elbow.
2. Hair is to be clean, neatly combed and covered as required by codes. Male employees must be clean shaven and all employees will practice good hygiene.
3. Clothes are to be kept clean at all times. Extra clean shirts should be kept on hand in case of a spill or other accident resulting in an employee's shirt being soiled.

The following is our recommendation.

*Concessionaire employees are asked to portray an image of professionalism as many people attending events perceive they are CAM-PLEX employees. This includes clean clothing at all times, good hygiene, and professional mannerisms. We appreciate your cooperation, as we do not want to restrict your services due to an inappropriate situation or a complaint.*

**Security Deposit:** We currently charge \$200 for a concessions room, \$500 if 20% contract and \$1,000 if renting the kitchen or 25% contract.




